The Sacred Heart community is divided into four houses: Lindisfarne, Rievaulx, Thanet, and Whitby. These houses are named after locations in England where Christianity was first established. Both staff and students are assigned to a house, with each form belonging to one of the houses. Every Thursday morning, members of each house gather for House assemblies led by the Head Of House. Throughout the year, students and staff participate in house events and inter-house competitions to earn points for their house. Sports Day contributes to the accumulation of points, with the total points determining which house will be named House of the Year!
