All-through news

A very warm welcome back to everyone following the Easter break. Despite still maintaining the Covid mitigations, it almost felt on Monday as if we were coming back to start a new academic year, which of course we are not! Whilst the sun shone, there were moments of sleet! However, there was definitely "hope and excitement" in the air as we saw the official opening of the Simon Balle Farm.

Many schools now have their own "animals or pets". We believe that having our own farm (albeit on a small scale) will bring many benefits. Children love animals and the discipline and responsibility of looking after them is a great learning experience. We have always emphasised the importance of the outdoors as an important space and this is an extension of our outdoor classroom and local habitats. Science and understanding nature takes on a different dimension and perhaps most importantly, the idea of "stewardship" can be taught and modelled. Whilst based in the Larch centre, a group of Y9 enthusiastic volunteers will have an opportunity to lead on a daily basis and a weekly rota. It is truly an all-through venture!

The Launch on Monday was an exciting event! We are so grateful to Mr Taylor and the Big Band for their first outdoor gig for some time - and it was so wonderful to welcome the music back! It is always an inspiration for our Larch children, and this we have awaited for some time! As well as our Year 9 farm leaders and the whole Larch, Busy Lizzies Nursery joined us too and we know already that they are really enjoying our farm and making important contributions to the animal care. It is funny really that a tortoise, rabbit, guinea pig or chicken have the power to connect us from Nursery - Year 13 as well as parents and staff too - but this is the community connection we need, perhaps now more than ever.

I met with a group of parents (reflecting the all-through) via google meet on Tuesday and we talked through the responsibilities for our community at the weekends and through the holidays. I was delighted by the number in attendance -more than 30 families! We thank you all in anticipation for your help with this great responsibility.

Doughies, a pizza company, will deliver individual, make at home, pizza kits to school which parents have pre-ordered. Kits are collected at home time. The kit which contains all ingredients retails for £6, but the company sell it to the school for less. We will be charging £6 which can be paid via parent pay, for a basic kit or more with extras (thinking keep it simple this time around and go with £6 per kit).

Kits are nut and seed-free, come with an allergen label, can be vegan but not gluten-free as the dough is tricky to work with.

Primary news

- Residential trips. We believe in the importance of residential trips for so many reasons. These include
 our school values (resilience, courage, kindness and more), the opportunity to develop socially and
 emotionally, an extension of the curriculum in many ways and just the pure excitement too! We have had
 to postpone trips due to Covid but we are now finalising plans to bring these back. It is important to us to
 ensure a progression in these outdoor learning experiences, building from all we do at Simon Balle, to first
 steps away, to links with fieldwork in geography, and then connecting with opportunities in our secondary
 phase. More detailed information will follow in relation to your child's year group, but we have now
 reserved residential trips for:
 - Our first Year 6 cohort, whose Year 5 residential has, unfortunately, had to be postponed. This will now take place at WildChild adventure (<u>https://www.wildchildadventure.com/</u>) in May 2022.
 - Year 5 residential for our current Year 4 children. This will take place in June 2022.
 - Looking far forward, our plans were originally for the Year 5 residential to take place in the September of Year 5, and therefore this is our booking for the current Year 3 for September 2022.
 Much more news to follow!
- **Reporting to parents Summer term 2021.** We trust and hope that you know how much we value the partnership between home and school at Simon Balle. It is so important for every area of children's development, including their social, personal, and academic progress as well as all aspects of enrichment. This partnership has, I think it is fair to say, been fully tested with the impact of Covid-19! We have considered carefully how to meet with you in this summer term, and our offer for the Larch will be two-fold:
 - We will write written reports, on Go for Schools for Years 1 5 and on Tapestry for Reception, which will be published on Friday 2nd July. These will contain all sorts of important information, including your child's personal development, their academic attainment in relation to age-expected levels, their progress, the areas in which they thrive, the ways in which they show our school values and the ways in which they learn best. We aim for these reports to be clear, to support your

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- child to be proud of all they have achieved, and to help guide the next steps for home learning and in transition to a new year group.
- Class teachers will also meet with each parent virtually (through School Cloud as with other 'meetings' this year) during the week beginning 5th July. As a result of both a written report and a meeting, reports will be shorter than usual. This is because we believe the connection between school and home is so important after the complexities of the year we have all had! At this meeting, you will be able to raise any questions you have following the written report and discuss together the support, and challenge, for your child in their move to a new year group.

We have considered our communication with you very carefully and we intend this to be a very helpful and open process in which we can celebrate how amazingly well your children have adapted to the challenges of the last year - fantastic flexibility, resilience, hope and more!

- **Reading.** The Larch really is a wonderful centre of reading! There is so much to celebrate from children enjoying choosing books in the library, to whole classes enjoying reading a shared text (often working on a specific content domain - from predicting to summarising to inferring, for example), to the 1:1 reading which is so beneficial for children's phonics, decoding and comprehension, to the love of listening to stories- all the way from Reception - Year 5 (and beyond)! I know I have said this before, but if I could ask one thing of parents, please ensure that your child reads to you each and every day and that this is recorded in their reading records. It does not need to be for long, but we see so, so often, the fantastic impact that this has on children's love of learning (not just reading) and their access to and unlocking of learning across the whole curriculum. Thank you for all of your support. We are running a number of interventions with reading this term to support children, and these interventions are for children of all abilities - to challenge children to the next level, to support their next steps. Reading fluency, led by Mrs Bloss, is a wonderful programme that helps children to develop their expressive reading which in turn supports their comprehension and their reading speed too. Reading eggs is a highly motivating programme to build phonics, tricky words, reading stamina and more. Each class will have additional approaches too - children who are daily readers for us, a range of phonics groups, a focus on written comprehension and more. If you have any questions at all, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.
- Extra-curricular opportunities. We are so excited with all that is taking place! From Mandarin to journalistic writing, from cricket to baking, karate to orchestra, choir to farm club, football to athletics, running to drama to arts and crafts! We are delighted to be able to re-introduce our full extra-curricular offer and we hope that your children will enjoy all that is in place this term. An enormous thank you to all staff and to parents for your support.

Other news

- Vacancies:
 - We are looking to appoint a Midday Supervisor for our Larch Centre. If you would like more details please contact either of the school offices and we will give you a job description and information on how to apply. The post is permanent 5 days per week term time only. The closing date for applications is Friday 30th April.
 - Advance notice Classroom support (particularly SEND, Literacy). We will be advertising shortly for staff, so if you are interested or know anyone who is, please do contact us as soon as possible.
- School lunches/partnership with Accent. Accent catering and Simon Balle have now set up daily 'lunch inspectors' as children in KS2. With a clear feedback form to complete, children daily comment in a number of areas, and complete free comments, in conversation with their friends. This will lead to a 'You said, We did' board in the Larch a great idea to promote responsibility and an honest reflection of how restaurants work in the world outside school. We will keep you posted!

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- Bikes. Please remember that if your children cycle to school (which we absolutely encourage!), it is
 important for them to be locked in the bike racks in front of the Larch. Whilst they will be absolutely safe
 during the school day, the school site is impossible to completely close from pedestrians overnight,
 weekends and holidays, so locks are required.
- **Safety.** We do understand that the tree by the swimming pool is an inviting climb! As you all know, we are a school that promotes a love of outdoor learning and risk-taking! But, a reminder to parents that this is an area that needs supervision. Please respect our Covid bubbles in place, and please make sure that no child is unsupervised in this area.

PRICING

Doughies offers schools a discountes rate on our regular pricing. We charge you £4 per single pizza kit, which you can sell for £6. Each family can order as many as they'd like and we package them as singles, doubles or triples to ensure minimal packaging waste. A school of 400 students typically sells between 250 and 300 kits as many parents buy multiple units for the whole family to participate.

A number of schools we've worked with have approached local businesses to 'sponsor' their event - this typically involves local businesses including a flyer within each bag. In our experience, local companies are keen to be involved and it provides a nice boost to your total raised. We are happy to include this material within your kits.

PLANNING YOUR EVENT

We generally require a week's notice to ensure we can plan your event and arrange any necessary customisation. We then need your final order numbers 4 days before the event. We pack the kits in triple-walled boxes to keep them cool, and deliver your order as close to when parents will collect them as possible. The kit is delivered in perfect condition for use either that evening, or within 48 hours of delivery providing it is kept refrigerated.

Once we receive final numbers of how many single and double kits you would like, you'll receive an invoice which is payable in advance, either online by card, or by bank transfer.
