All-through news

Dear Families,

We now close for the half-term holiday, after what has been a longer than usual summer term 1, coupled with extraordinarily unseasonable weather. Covid-19

Whilst we are slowly returning to the normal patterns and routines, and indeed we continue to reintroduce our normal procedures, we are constantly reminded of the fact that mitigations against the Covid virus are still enforced in school with regular hand sanitising, the operation of bubbles, an emphasis upon being outdoors and restricted activities. There continue to be cases in East Hertfordshire so there is no room for any complacency.

Family responsibilities

We remind you that:

- Masks should be worn by adults in many indoor spaces
- There are rules about social distancing and indoor mixing
- Young people and children should also abide by these restrictions
- Hand hygiene is very important
- LFTs still should be used with secondary students x 2 a week

Travel

Please be aware when booking holidays that caution must be taken and risks weighed up should you be considering a foreign holiday. Quarantine rules are highly likely to change quickly, and self-isolation will be imposed. We, therefore, ask all families if booking a summer holiday abroad that they ensure that they are back in the UK by 22 August 2021, to allow for a 10-day quarantine. If children do not return to school, this is an unauthorised absence. Term-time holidays are not allowed. This, as we are sure you will understand, is beyond our control, and this message is given because we are so motivated to provide the highest quality of education for every student in our care.

Teaching and learning celebrations

There has been much to celebrate in the last fortnight! I have been overwhelmed, and delighted, with so many children visiting me to go into our Larch star book. This half term, your children have shown such a commitment to pride and enthusiasm in their learning. Here are some highlights:

- Year 4 children visited me today sharing some exceptional writing. Much of this writing was the children's best writing this year! They were inspired to write explanation texts about how a fridge or toaster or television works! As well as using all of the important features needed for an explanation text, they were supported to be wonderfully creative and I read all sorts of ideas from fairies in my fridge to fire-throwing genies in my toaster!
- I was fortunate to be able to give out many **music certificates and badges** today, from Year 2 all the way to Year 5. In a year where music ensembles and concerts have necessarily been curtailed, it has been inspiring indeed to see the great efforts made by so many individual students to make such fantastic progress on their instruments. Many more certificates and badges are on their way; please do look forward to us celebrating Larch music next half term with parents too; more news to follow!
- I have been privileged indeed to visit Year 2 and 3 during their **swimming** lessons this half term. Whilst I am sure that children, parents and staff were delighted to see swimming return in April, it was with a little trepidation by many as it was clear that children had missed out on so much in the last year. This was not evident when I visited the pool on Tuesday! Confidence in the water was shown by absolutely all, and measurable progress was also clear to see. Please see below for updates for summer 2.
- Our club offer has been so well received this half term and we are delighted to see children engage in extra-curricular learning. From Busy Lizzies (and all of their varied offer) to KS1 clubs to Explorers, it has

been a busy half term. Do look out for social media posts in celebration, as we have some lovely photographs to share. As we begin Summer 2, please look forward to a broad offering including mindfulness to crafts, cycling and orienteering to rugby, rounders to football, myths/legends to continuing orchestra and choirs. Our extra-curricular offer extends all within our main curriculum, so a huge thank you to parents for supporting the importance of this. We will write later in Summer 2 in relation to our offer for September: just a reminder here please that we will need parents to please sign up **before the allocated deadline.** With the numbers involved, and indeed another 60 children in September, it is becoming impossible to allocate spaces once the deadline has passed. Thank you for your understanding.

- **Timings of the school day.** Following the email sent earlier this week, just to confirm the times of the school day for the Larch from Monday 7th June (following half term):
 - 8.40am 8.50am soft start. Children of all year groups may come straight into class within this 10 minute window (allowing parents to drop children of different ages too). Please note that any child arriving after 8.50am will be late and will miss the start to their morning learning.
 - 3.15pm 3.20pm. We have allowed a 5 minute period at the end of the day just to allow parents picking up children of different ages from different places to do so. Please arrive for 3.15pm.

We are excited about this change to timings, as it will ensure a purposeful start to learning for all, and allow us to maximise teaching times through the school day. Please do ensure that you are punctual to drop off and to pick up.

- Uniform. We have completely understood the challenges with children's school uniform this year, for example with shoe shops closed! As we enter this final half term, please can we remind you of our expectations for uniform, found here: https://www.simonballe.herts.sch.uk/daily-life/uniform/
 Trainers are needed for PE, and for use on our trim trail and playground treehouse. However, school shoes (black) must be worn to and from school and for most of the school day.
 It is important too to remind parents that the Simon Balle rucksack is only for Year 3 +. We do understand that it is tempting to purchase this for younger children, but it is a privilege which all children will gain in time! In the younger years, we need easy access to support children with changing their reading book, and all of their items must fit on a cloakroom peg. Thank you for your support.

- Swimming. We are really excited to let you know that we are going to continue with swimming for Year 2 and Year 3 children after half term. These year groups missed their swimming provision last year and we felt it was important while the children were making progress and we have this opportunity to continue this for another 6 weeks. We know this will really support the children in their swimming journeys and ensure that the children have vital life skills which we all know are so important to keep our children safe in the outside world. Please can we ask Year 2 and Year 3 parents to kindly make a voluntary donation of £10 to support with the upkeep of our swimming pool which we are so lucky to have at school. In order to make a donation please find on parent pay the correct year group with swimming next to it. I am sure you agree this is extremely reasonable for the opportunity the children are receiving.

Year 1 parents will have seen a letter go out this week as they will be starting their swimming lessons after half term as well.

To confirm days for swimming:

- Year 1 and Year 2 will swim on Tuesday afternoons.
- Year 3 will now swim on a Friday afternoon.

We will continue our swimming provision with other year groups in the Larch in the Autumn term and will let you know more information regarding this nearer the time. Our aim is for all children in Year 1-Year 6 to have the opportunity to swim for at least one half term within the academic year.
