Primary sports days

Secondary sports day



Congratulations to all musicians for their achievements this year. We have held over 240 individual music exams. This is an amazing achievement, showing perseverance and hard work through all the challenges. As part of this, seven Year 13 musicians have achieved a diploma at a standard of first or second-year music college. To have this number of students taking these very challenging exams is unique in any school and we cannot underestimate the enormity of what has been achieved. Our senior musicians have also achieved 29 Grade 8s between them, most with a merit or distinction. In the Larch, 53 musicians took a music medal this year and several have achieved Grade 1 or 2. All-through enrichment

Years, 6, 7 and 8

Beginning in September 2021, we are very excited to launch our Wednesday Enrichment Programme for Years 6, 7 and 8. This programme is designed to ignite a passion for learning in students as well as to assist them to develop wider skills, flexibility and resourcefulness. We know that enrichment gives children opportunities to try new and varied activities that develop character, resilience and motivation, and encourage them to pursue wider goals which is why we feel this wider-ranging programme will be an intrinsic part of the school experience. We have been so thrilled to see the take-up of this fantastic opportunity where students will have the opportunity to enjoy, amongst other things, clubs such as STEM, Art and The World Around Us. The clubs run each Wednesday from 3.20 - 4.20 pm.

Today, email confirmation has been sent to all students who have a place at a club for Autumn 1. If you have not received confirmation, please do not worry; we will be subsequently sending invitations for Autumn 2 and beyond; all students who have requested a place will receive one for at least one-half term of the academic year.

Sixth form enrichment

As we look forward to returning to some form of normality from September, we are excited to re-launch the many enrichment opportunities available in order to participate in the co-curricular life of the school. Not only does engagement in these opportunities provide our Sixth Form with the foundations for a strong Post-18 application, but also develops the character and personality traits that will enable them to be successful in the wider

Whether it be leadership roles, volunteering activities, extra-curricular sports or music or just learning interesting new skills and hobbies, these opportunities have been designed to improve students' communication skills, confidence, teamwork, resilience, responsibility, innovation and enable them to become role models in the Simon Balle community. Explorers (Years 3 - 5) and KS1 clubs

All parents will have now received their confirmation for Explorers clubs in Autumn 1. From Tag rugby to calligraphy, from orchestra to choir, from dance/aerobics to badminton, and more - we are excited to welcome students to a new year. KS1 club invitations will also go out in September, as we begin clubs for children in Years 1 and 2 in Autumn 2 when they are settled into their new year groups. Thanks to all staff - an exciting year ahead!

Timings of the school day: secondary

This past year has meant that we have had to change various timings to allow the "bubbles" to move. With the removal of bubbles, we can now return to some more normal routines. From September the school day will be tweaked to:

- 8.30 All students on site
- 8.35 All students to walk to the room for lesson 1
- 8.40 Lesson 1
- 9.40 Lesson 2

Break (10.40- 11.00)

11.00 Lesson 3

12.00 Lesson 4

Lunch (1.00- 1.45)

- 1.40 Warning bell; students move to form rooms
- 1.45 Tutor time
- 2.10 Lesson 6
- 3.10- Formal end of the school day- enrichment activities to take place

Timings of the school day: primary

In the primary phase, all year groups will continue with a soft start 8.40 am - 8.50 am each morning. **All children must be in school by 8.50 am please when the first lesson will begin.** 8.40 am - 8.50 am will be used for valuable activities such as early morning work, children returning to feedback from marking during the previous day and early reading. The day will end at 3.15 pm, and classroom doors will be kept open until 3.20 pm, as we, of course, understand that parents may be picking up at two or more pick-up points.

As many of our families now have children in both primary and secondary phases of the school, it is important that we clarify pick up expectations:

- Children in Reception Year 2 must be picked up by a parent please (or please let us know in the communication book in the Larch if they are being picked up by a grandparent or other known adult)
- Years 3+ may be picked up by a sibling in the secondary phase, if parental permission is granted. This can be given through emailing larch@simonballe.herts.sch.uk



- As we strive to support children's developing independence, Year 5 may walk home independently from January of the relevant year, with parental permission (as above). This will vary from family to family, dependent on the address and other factors, but it is there as an option if families think this is right for them.
- We will continue to ensure that we work hard as a school to support children with all aspects of their developing independence and responsibility, through our learning for life curriculum (for example, road safety, e-safety and more).

A change to 'Test and Trace'

As a result of feedback from parents, NHS Test and Trace have introduced household accounts. This allows parents to save their children's details to their own user accounts so parents can report results for multiple members in the household more quickly and easily.

When reporting self-test results parents will now be offered the opportunity to create a household account, which should take no more than 2 minutes. Parents can then add all household members to their account, enabling them to save time when reporting all future self-test results.

Uniform

Please can we remind all parents of the need for a full correct uniform from the very first day in September. Not only does this mean correct clothing (new Y10, please purchase the burgundy jumper) but also no jewellery, no nail polish or false nails; if earrings, small studs and not hoops or rings, and correct hair colour and cut (not shaven or extreme short cuts). Correct shoes should be worn. These expectations are incredibly important across our all-through school so please check https://www.simonballe.herts.sch.uk/daily-life/uniform/ with any queries. It is important that every phase of the school is in line with expectations; so, for example, the Simon Balle rucksack in the primary phase is only for children in Years 3+.

An exciting new opportunity for groups of our students as well as a job vacancy!

Simon Balle All-through School will be one of only five schools in Hertfordshire who will be working with the national organisation "MCR Coaching" (motivation, commitment and resilience focus). This is a school-based mentoring programme, which has been adopted throughout Scotland, over many years, and shown great impact. MCR coaching are now working with several local authorities in England, one of which is Hertfordshire. Whilst mainly focused upon secondary aged students, the programme also works with Year 6 prior to transition. We are so excited to be asked to be part of this programme. It supports young people, including some of our most vulnerable students, to realise their potential through education - echoing our own ethos here at Simon Balle.

In the late summer, we will be looking to appoint our school-based "pathways coordinator", advertised on our school website, as well as "Teach in Herts" - https://www.teachinherts.com/. This will be a full-time job, with a salary of around £25k.

If you are passionate about supporting young people to realise their potential, this may be the role for you or someone you know.

In addition, the programme is dependent upon local community members (and employees) to become trained mentors for those students in KS4.

Secondary news



"Natasha's Law" update from our caterers

From 1st October, there is a substantial change to the law in terms of the food labelling requirements for pre-packaged goods for direct sale. This change requires all pre-packaged goods to be fully labelled with both allergen information and the individual ingredients of each item offered for sale. The law is also known as Natasha's Law.

Our catering partner, Accent Catering, makes all their pre-packaged goods fresh everyday on site. During the last few weeks of this term, they have been busy training their teams, introducing new recipes, packaging and labelling systems to ensure they are fully prepared to comply with these new regulations. This affects all sandwiches, bread products, pre-wrapped bakery goods, salad boxes and in fact, any food item that is offered for sale in a sealed package or container.

When our students return in September, they will see new products in new packaging and new labelling. The recipes have been developed to meet the needs of most of our students but if your child cannot find what they are looking for, they only need to ask one of the catering team who will be delighted to assist them. The extensive allergen controls remain in place but the team remains committed to providing special diets and requirements on request if they are not covered by the core menu.

We look forward to welcoming all our students to the dining room when the term starts in September.

HCC need your help to gather views on vaccinations for young people aged 12-17

We are waiting for a decision from the Government on offering a vaccination programme for young people aged 12-17. In the meantime, HCC is running a survey to gather feedback from young people and parents and carers which they hope will provide a better understanding of their views and plan effectively should the government decide to go ahead.
