The successful applicant will work with the Assistant Head teacher to implement the MCR Pathways programme at Simon Balle All-through School from October 2021. MCR Pathways is a transformational secondary school mentoring and talent development programme supporting Children Looked After (including those previously), and other vulnerable young people experiencing disadvantage (for example those with a social worker or on the periphery of the care-system) to realise their full potential through education.

For this role, you will need to be relentlessly driven to ensure all care-experienced and disadvantaged students are supported to find, grow and use their individual talents and that their education, employment choices and life chances outcomes are maximized. You will have experience of working with young people, be highly organized and infectiously ambitious for all the young people with whom you work.
