Covid absence update

If a sibling under 18 years old has not tested positive from a PCR test with the rest of the family, they should come to school. If not, their absence will be marked as unauthorised. Siblings, if eligible to do so, should take a Lateral flow test everyday before attending school. The day's absence to take the PCR test is marked by code XO4 which denotes an authorised absence.

Covid – test and report

We would like to remind students to test twice-weekly for COVID-19 at home. Reporting your tests, whether positive, negative or void, is as important as taking the test itself, as reporting results helps us understand the spread of the virus in local areas.

Lateral flow device (LFD) tests have been widely and successfully used to detect asymptomatic COVID-19 cases. A recent study has shown that the accuracy of LFD tests was more than 80% effective at detecting any level of COVID-19 infection and likely to be more than 90% effective at detecting the most infectious people at the point of testing. The GOV.UK notify service enables education settings to remind students and parents to test and report easily, quickly and at no extra cost. Please make use of this service. Please test and report regularly.

Geography field trip to Walton on the Naze
