Dear Parent / Guardian Re:

We are writing to you as a parent or guardian of a young person who attends a secondary school within Hertford, regarding recent reports of anti-social behaviour, within the local vicinity, carried out by young persons.

Reports of anti-social behaviour include a group of young people entering shops and removing stock items from shelves and discarding these within the store, being abusive to staff, throwing eggs at premises and at members of public and refusing to leave shops when asked.

We appreciate that these reported incidents relate to a minority of young people within our community however, by working together, East Herts Community Safety Partnership\* (CSP) want to ensure that anti-social behaviour does not affect residents and businesses.

As a parent or guardian of a young person we kindly ask for your support in helping to keep our communities safe. We request that, where necessary, you open/continue dialogue with your child/children to ensure you know their whereabouts, as well as any activities they are engaged in, after school hours, at the weekend and during school holidays.

In addition, if you have any concerns relating to any anti-social behaviour activities your child/children is involved with, friendship groups they are keeping, or hear of any activity you believe relates to anti-social behaviour, please report this to Herts Police on 101 or via email community.safety@eastherts.gov.uk.

\*The CSP is made up of agencies including Herts Police, East Herts Council, Herts Fire &Rescue, Housing Associations, Hertfordshire County Council Please be aware that Police will be using powers under the ASB Crime and Policing Act to tackle anti-social behaviour and information of those

responsible for any anti-social behaviour will be shared with schools and other relevant agencies (such as Housing providers).

We would like to thank you in advance for your support in keeping East Herts a safe place to live, visit and work and not allowing the behaviour of the minority to negatively impact upon communities.
