Attendance update

We are so very proud of the increased levels of attendance across all phases this term and also the fantastic uptake of enrichment both before and after school. Attendance at our virtual parents' evenings and specific year group events at school have also been exceptional and we thank you for your support.

The updated attendance policy will soon be available to view on the website and we wanted to remind you of the protocols and expectations with regard to attendance, to ensure that attendance 'bounces back' following C-19 and periods of lockdown.

It is expected that all students will arrive at their lesson by 8.35am to start lessons at 8.40am in the secondary phase and 8.50am in the Primary phase. Registers will close 20 minutes after those times. Parents/carers must call into the school to report any absence as soon as possible.

At Simon Balle All-through School, our aim is to prepare students for their future lives and careers.

With this in mind, we require parents/carers to observe the school holidays as prescribed. It is strongly recommended that holidays are not taken during term time and will only be authorised by the Headteacher, in exceptional circumstances once written permission has been sought.

Any requests for leave during term time must be made through the schools centralised system online and will be considered on an individual basis and the student's previous attendance record will be taken into account.

It is also recognised that some students have medical reasons or have struggled with the return to school and need support from our pastoral team.

Our vision of an all through school, born in 2014, has become so much of a reality over the past few weeks! I felt so humbled and privileged to attend the Coram Shakespeare Festival in Finchley, whereby our 62 Year 6's performed Macbeth. The students took up this challenge and performed magnificently with confidence and maturity. This week, nationally all parents of children in Y6 received notification of their secondary school. Obviously our students in the "Larch" do not need to apply for in an all through school, an automatic place is given. However, once again the vision of all through is happening, as our Y6 will become the new Y7 joining 120 fellow Y6 students in local Hertford schools. A warm welcome to all.

Science in our All-through school

As a school, we are always outward-facing and always looking to invite feedback about what we do well and where we can look for exciting next steps and opportunities for growth. Part of this professional development for leaders and for all staff is through our work with Herts for Learning. Yesterday we invited expert visitors to our all-through school to look at our teaching and learning in science: our HIPs (Hertfordshire improvement partners) enjoyed visiting lessons from Reception to Year 13; they greatly valued speaking with our young people, often with their science books again right the way across our all-through school; they spent time with leaders and teachers at all levels understanding the rationale behind the way that we have designed our bespoke curriculum at Simon Balle All-through school. There is too much to share here! But, they were pleased to note how the strength of relationships (teacher-student and student-student is underpinning all enjoyment and readiness for learning); they evaluated our work within personal development to be very strong indeed; our curriculum is progressive and knowledge-rich; our curriculum is taught as

intended; and enrichment opportunities and opportunities to work scientifically are plentiful. We are always open to next steps, and we look forward to our written report. This was an exciting day to visit lessons across the 14-year journey that our students can experience with us.
