Vaccination centres have been made child friendly with a range of fun activities available and staff have decorated the centres to make them welcoming for children. Appointment slots have been made longer so that parents and carers have plenty of time to talk to vaccinators and ask questions.

Over the past few weeks, we have started our Summer sports programme and all students are enjoying participating in Athletics, and for some it is

their first experience of summer sports. The County Athletics League is now in full swing as well as Rounders and District fixtures.

On Tuesday the Year 8 Basketball team competed in a three way play off for the chance to win the District League. The season ended with Simon Balle, John Warner and Chauncy tied on points. After beating John Warner, we played a competitive final game against Chauncy with the winner becoming District champions. In a closely contested game Chauncy won 10-7, with the team playing their best game to date. Well done to all on an excellent season.



Last Wednesday saw the start of the County Athletics League, for the first time since 2019. Chancellors School hosted the event at Wodson park which produced a highly competitive athletics meet. E. Wines in Year 7 won the Long Jump, jumping 4.39m which was the longest jump of the day across both age-groups. J. Adamson in his first Pole Vault competition produced a personal best jump of 2.15m winning the Y9/10 boys event. Overall the age-group results were as follows;

- Round 6 - Stevenage (Ridlins) - Weds 15th June

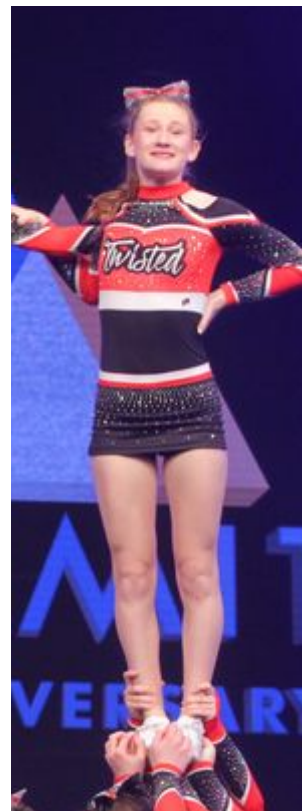
Congratulations to one of our ex students Ciara Lynch who has been selected to represent Ireland at the Netball European Championships this summer, we wish her all the best.

## ***Have you got working Smoke Detectors?***

*Please check you have working smoke detectors at home. You should have a smoke detector on every floor in your home, preferably in the hallways and close to bedrooms where possible. Check your detectors work once a week by pushing the button in the middle. Don't forget to change the battery once a year – pick a date that is memorable such as your birthday or Christmas so that you remember!*

*If you do not have smoke detectors at home, Herts Fire and Rescue will carry out a safe and well check for you. They will fit smoke detectors for you for free.*

- *It won't cost you a penny and it could save your life.*
- *All visits are agreed by appointment only at a time to suit you.*
- *Only uniformed staff will visit and will always carry an ID card.*



## CO/Gas Safe

- Carbon monoxide is a colourless, odourless, and tasteless flammable gas that is slightly less dense than air.

- Unsafe gas appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions and carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Ensure you know where to turn your gas off at the mains. It is usually situated close to your gas meter.

Ensure there is adequate ventilation in any rooms where gas appliances are situated.

Arrange for a Gas Safe registered engineer to check it over annually and repair/replace if necessary.

Contact a Qualified Gas Safe Engineer if you notice any of the following signs around your boiler:

Increased condensation

Floppy yellow flame

Sooty stain in or around your appliance

Consider fitting a Co2 detector in your home. It should be placed by the main source of Carbon Monoxide in your property such as next to the open fireplace or heating system (combi boiler).



## BE SCHOOL SAFE!

*The Governing body and the head teacher are responsible for the day-to-day running of the school and the management of all the systems, including fire safety.*

### **FIRE SAFETY ADVICE FOR SCHOOLS**

1. *The estimated cost of a school fire in the UK is £2.8 million*
2. *75% of school fires are the result of arson.*
3. *Children in the age group 10-16 are responsible for 50% of all deliberately set school fires.*
4. *Pupils and ex pupils are generally responsible for deliberately set school fires*
5. *Each year HFRS attends around 180 calls to fires in or around school premises.*

### **WHAT YOU CAN DO TO REDUCE THE RISK**

*Good housekeeping is the key to reducing the risk of arson at your school. HFRS can work with you to assess the risk, where necessary, and can recommend actions you can take to reduce it. Things to look out for include*

1. *Litter*
2. *Graffiti*
3. *Minor and major break-ins*
4. *Minor arson incidents*

### **The schools arson audit covers the following areas:**

- *Entry onto premises*
- *Entry into buildings*
- *Opportunity to start a fire*
- *Scope to start a fire*
