Art - Subway transformation

Hertford secondary school students have visited a recently refurbished subway to see how their art has transformed the subway into a modern art gallery. This subway project for London Road and St Andrew Street started in 2020 with funding from the Aldi Development and a grant from Defra for air quality improvements. The aim of the project is to improve active travel routes to encourage more people to walk and cycle, leaving their car at home for shorter journeys. This project is all about working with the local schools and community. For the third year in a row, the students from Richard Hale School, The Sele School and Simon Balle All-through school have provided art worthy of a London gallery for the London Road subway in Hertford. The students are very talented, and this project gives these young people the opportunity to display their work in a public space and at the same time improving the local environment for everyone. County Council said "This really is a great project, working with both local schools and the community to encourage active travel, reduce car use and improve the Environment "It forms part of Hertfordshire County Council subway refurbishment programme and links into both the Local Transport Plan and the Corporate Plan vision of 'creating a cleaner, greener, healthier Hertfordshire for all.' Local member and former Hertford Mayor Cllr Bob Deering joined the new Mayor, Cllr Sue Barber to see the latest art installation.

Cllr Deering said: "I am very proud of our gifted young students who have once again produced outstanding work for everyone to enjoy. This subway is a popular route for access into town and to the local schools and we want to encourage more walking and cycling across the town."

Ian Hawkins, Headteacher at Richard Hale school said "It is great for the students to have the opportunity to contribute to a local community project, which enables the community to enjoy their work. This project has allowed the students to showcase their talents to a wide audience and we are very proud of all the students involved."

A spokesperson for Sele school said "This project really enables us to showcase some of the incredible talent and commitment our students have to their Art studies. We really enjoy being able to showcase some of the talents our students have to offer."

Alison Saunders, Headteacher at Simon Balle All-through school said "I am extremely proud of the student's artwork and was pleased that so many people in the local community would be able to admire it as they walked through the town's subways."

This is just the first stage for this year's new art for Hertford and we are launching the community art competition for our second subway art gallery located between St Andrew Street and Aldi.

The theme for the competition is places to see and visit by foot, bike and scooter and we are looking forward to seeing lots of interesting entries. So, get your paintbrush ready or your camera charged and enter this year's competition and join our young artists in making Hertford the art centre of Hertfordshire. Explorers 2022-2023

The Explorers after-school club offer for Years 3 - 6 after school for Autumn 1 will be released on Monday - please do look out for the great range of activities on offer. We release one half term at a time, but the offer across the year is exceptionally exciting - every sport we can think of (genuinely!), arts and crafts, choir and orchestras, chess and science, maths reasoning and yoga, Sketch-up (computer design) and running, dance and Spanish, crochet and Mandarin and more. I would like to take this opportunity to thank staff very much for all that they offer - this is an enrichment programme which is so comprehensive and we know that commitment to learning in these areas is so beneficial for children's wellbeing and happiness, as well as the skills themselves. Please do talk to your children about what they would like to join - and welcome to our Year 2 cohort now joining Year 3! We have kept prices in line with this year to ensure that clubs are as affordable as is possible, with free and inclusive clubs available for Years 5 and 6 with football and netball training on a Monday, and Spanish on a Tuesday.

A few reminders about Explorers are as follows:

- Please sign up promptly upon receiving the google form - with such large numbers enjoying clubs, we can no longer accept late returns - thank you for your understanding.
- Activities run from 3.30 4.30pm at Explorers. There are some time differences for a small number of clubs (Karate, choir, for example) but these are all specified on the google form. We look after your children from 3.15 3.30pm where they move to the right places and change where necessary. We are more than happy to also look after your children from 4.30 4.45pm, partly so that Explorers and Busy Lizzies pick-up times are aligned, but please feel free to pick up from 4.30pm if you prefer. Pick -up places will be confirmed by the Explorers team for each club on each evening.
- All children must commit for a half term of activities and must attend for the full hour.
 This is how they will thrive and flourish! From 4.45 - 6pm is where childcare is offered, and pick-up is completely flexible during this time.
