All-through news

This week has been a very special one as we have welcomed back our community; our youngest children joining us in reception for their first morning, along with their teddy bears or equivalent for a lunchtime picnic. Now towards the end of the week they are already settled! The rest of the classes in The Larch have been busy with their learning and once again shown great community values. Year 7 have equally settled well and by attending summer school for 3 days during the summer, transition appears to be guite smooth and the school familiar. Assemblies have been held for every year group: the new Y12 have slotted in well to the life of the sixth form and we look forward to seeing them volunteer and welcome responsibility.

Both Mrs Kirk and I have spent time visiting classes in both phases and it is exciting to see the passion for learning return.

As a school we constantly celebrate our students achievements and efforts. We are proud to announce the rerun of our "Awards Evening" albeit later this year. The ceremony will take place on Thursday 22 September at 6pm at All Saints Church. Invites are in hand and our guest speaker this year is our own Rob Klippel. Rob spent many years on our Senior Leadership team and has just retired, teaching 2 days a week. Rob is a "Simon Balle" Legend and will entertain us I am sure with many stories! Further details will follow but a big well done to all students from Reception to Y13.

We also welcome the return of our "Open Morning" on Saturday 24 September. This year is different as

we are inviting both prospective parents for reception (2023) and Y7. Please see below for secondary information. Governors acknowledge the hard work from staff and students alike-hence an additional day of leave in November.

We are so proud of all of the achievements made by students in the summer of 2022. We couldn't possibly do justice to all here, but, for an overview please do visit our website pages:

We are incredibly grateful for all parental support for all students in every phase of our all-through school. Some highlights:

- In Early Years, we are delighted that the partnership between home and school has resulted in such a high percentage of children (much higher than the Hertfordshire comparisons) being so ready for their learning in KS1 across so many subject areas. In particular, their personal, social and emotional development, and their early reading and understanding of the world stands all in such great stead for future learning.
- In KS1, a huge well done to Year 1, where 98% of children achieved an expected level in phonics - amazing readiness for the world of reading in Year 2 and far, far beyond! Equally our KS1 SATs results remain high, and well above the national average for 2019 in every indicator.
- In KS2, 89% of our Year 6 cohort achieved an expected level in reading, writing and mathematics as this compares to 59% nationally, we can be confident that our children are so well prepared for their next steps ahead. Our Year 4 cohort too showed high levels of number recall in the first year of the statutory and national multiplication check: 77% of children achieving 23/25+.

Parking

It is lovely to see so many families and students walking to and from school and using the park and stride facility next to the fire station. There is also a

'walking bus' to bring students to the school from this car park.

However, we are very disappointed that we have already received complaints from neighbours about parents driving too fast and parking where they should not park. Harrison Lane is a private road and should NOT be used for dropping off or picking up. Residents have told us that drivers have been abusive to them when they have been asked to move. The vast majority of our students live within walking distance of the school so there should be no need for them to be driven to the school. If you require a permit to park for 1 hour free at the Old London Road car park please ask at either reception.

Nut awareness and allergies

At Simon Balle we operate a nut free environment in all of our catering and curriculum activities. It is not possible to guarantee or enforce a nut free school and as such we say we are "nut aware". A free-from environment creates a false sense of security and does not prepare children for environments where nuts may be present.

Each year, all of the teaching staff in the Larch Centre and the first aiders in the rest of the school complete a refresher course in the use of Epipens and how to recognise anaphylaxis. We even give training to our Year 6 students as an essential life skill.

We would like to remind parents and students in all phases of our school to not bring nuts in any form into school and especially not in packed lunches. If any of the student body would like training or further awareness of anaphylaxis please contact Mr Tweed.

Environment Update

Lots of work has been taking place over the summer to help us reduce our impact on the environment. Energy efficient lighting has been installed throughout the site, upgrades have been made to pipework to reduce leaks and blue bins for mixed recycling have been placed in every classroom. Staff and students can help by using the correct bins for waste, and switching off lights and electrical equipment when not in use. In addition to this, students from years 7 and 8 will be involved in an action research project to monitor and reduce waste and energy consumption around the school site. Our focus upon energy efficiency is of course two fold as we, like all households are facing a colossal hike in our bills and we similar to businesses will receive no "cap". We will be asking all members of our community to help us with energy efficiencies-lightscomputers- and once the winter arrives looking at how we heat areas of the school. Our solar panels have been very successful over the past years and once again demonstrate our commitment to sustainability.

And so, back to the excitement of classroom learning this term. Mrs Boyce is sharing below just a sense of the awe and wonder in classrooms we have experienced this week. The Larch has been so full of calm and readiness to learn, as well as great enthusiasm for summer learning (thank you to all parents) and excitement about the curriculum to follow!

A couple of small reminders please:

• Can parents with children in Years 3 - 6 please remember that it is a healthy, nut-free snack to be provided for break time please? For

Reception - Year 2, fruit is provided and nothing else should be sent in please. For Years 3 - 6, we are happy for children to have fruit, rice cakes, cereal bars, breadsticks, vegetable pots or similar. We do appreciate that Years 4 and 5 in particular need a substantial snack with a longer morning until lunch. Please do not send any crisps, chocolate or cakes - thank you for your understanding.

As we said at parent information evenings on Tuesday, please do remember how highly significant your role is at home in reading with your children daily. We are so appreciative of all that you do to, with us, promote a love of reading! All reading is valued in reading records - just let us know! Equally, please communicate with us as partners in reading, in relation to your child's sounding out, comprehension, ease or difficulty with the book, use of bookmarks sent home and more. We thank you in anticipation!

Learning in the Larch

The Larch have been full of learning and engaged children in their first week of the Autumn term! Reception have been welcoming our new, youngest children into the Larch and it has been fantastic to see the children settling so well into their new classes, building friendships, sharing, exploring and learning!

Year 1 were immersed in the farm when I visited, even finding an egg that had just been laid which created a lot of excitement and wonder from the children! They have been using the value of responsibility to check the animals have water, food and showing extra responsibility by checking their bedding was clean and droppings were picked up!

Across the afternoon Year 2 were practising their throwing and catching skills in PE and also working together to draft a formal letter to Mrs Saunders and Mrs Kirk about cake! They were able to confidently discuss the formal differences compared with writing to a friend.

Year 3 demonstrated their excellent science knowledge by explaining in detail what we need to stay alive and how to stay healthy- they were able to give lots of examples and explain why various things including nutrients are important!

Symbolism was the focus in a Year 4 PRE lesson, and the children were recalling their prior knowledge of what different symbols represent- their memories were very impressive! They were also designing symbols that represented themselves and it was brilliant to see the individuality of the children.

Year 5 were immersed in maths and demonstrating their fluency skills- moving between various areas of maths including demonstrating their short division (bus stop method) to solve calculations.

Year 6 have been reading extracts of their new literary canon book, 'The Spiderwick Field Guide', to create some fantastic writing such as recounting meeting a boggart and writing a warning to people to not to enter where a cocatrice may be lurking... It has been exciting to hear the children across the Larch talk about their literary canon books, and their excitement of Roald Dahl day where classes will immerse themselves more in the texts they have been reading.
