A big thank you to the Y8 parents who last week not only attended our "connection" meeting but have overwhelmingly provided such positive feedback. The key messages of the evening were around assessment and learning as well as keeping the young people safe.

The school calendar each year is full of regular events. Last week was the ever popular "Volcano" day and from the onset of the all through school, some of our youngest children have joined with Y9 to learn more about volcanos. This year once again, the volcanos took a variety of forms; from models to pictures, cakes to explosive interactive designs. A wonderful and exciting day for all which has enriched the geography curriculum for Year 3 too.

Today, another important event will take place at school and no doubt we will share with you the details when we next communicate. As a school with little tradition (having been built in 1957) and wanting to establish community events which we believe share our values, several years ago we began to hold an annual "Remembrance Ceremony", held in the school playground. This year, now with so many young people and students on site, we will be holding two events. Once again, a group of students will take key roles, including this year two of our Ukrainian students who will read out the Ukrainian national anthem, as part of our ceremony.

- Reduce the published admission number (PAN) at 5 community primary schools for 2024/25
- Retain the remainder of the County Council's existing admission arrangements, including PANs, Relevant Areas and schemes of coordination for 2024/25

- 3. Hertfordshire County Council is a sustainable travel council and the school joins with its aims to protect the environment.

Larch students will be able to wear 1 spotty item on the day, with their school uniform – spotty socks, spotty tights, spotty jumper- just think spotty!


At BBC Children in Need, the money raised by you is put to work throughout the whole year. Students across all phases will be taking part in a number of activities that include quizzes, assemblies, surveys and student led activities.

On Friday students in Y7-10 will have the privilege of a live performance from the band 'Here at last'. They will then be delivering key messages about mental health, staying safe online and cyber bullying.



For anti-bullying week (14th-18th November) students will be completing the <u>SBAS Community</u> and <u>Kindness Calendar</u>. The SBAS Community and Kindness Calendar helps to encourage everyone at Simon Balle to think about kindness because, as we know, small acts of kindness can make a big difference.

Each day of the week, students will write down all the ways in which they have been helpful at home, been kind to themselves, helped their classmates and their teachers, shown kindness in the community, and helped to protect the environment.

### Antarctica day flag competition

On 1 December 1959, 12 countries signed the Antarctic Treaty – an international agreement to designate Antarctica as a continent of peace and cooperation.



Over sixty years on, the Antarctic Treaty has expanded to include 54 countries and continues to shine as a rare beacon of international cooperation. The Treaty governs much of the politics, activities and responsibilities within the Antarctic continent and waters south of 60 degrees latitude. For example, all scientific observations should be made freely available to all researchers, no military bases or weapons testing are allowed, and the dumping or burning of any rubbish is prohibited.

To celebrate this milestone of peace in our civilisation, the anniversary of the Treaty is recognised each year. The 1 December is celebrated globally.


