A Happy New Year to all.

Thank you once again for the messages of congratulations. Many of you will remember or know Cynthia Stroud (now Cynthia Tooley) formerly of "Pretty Gorgeous Cakes" and more latterly of "Jedidiah" food parcels. Cynthia has now relocated to Buckingham, continued her passion for Jedidah's work there, and remarried. Congratulations to Cynthia for she too has been awarded an MBE! Some of our families have been involved with Jedidiah, either giving or receiving help. As a school over the past few years our awareness that many of our families do struggle with the cost of living influences many decisions we make. We thought we would share just a few things we always consider: Trips- how many take place for a particular year group and are they a fair and inclusive price. Uniformhow much can be bought from local stores-ensuring we are not continuously asking for £1 donations or wearing special clothes (that often need to be bought, for example themed dress days, non uniform day). We know that many costs can not be avoided but please be assured that there is always support if requested and that we are only too aware of the issues faced by many families.

Despite some teething issues with our new security system on site, we believe that the new fencing and barriers are already ensuring that the site is safe at all times of the day. We thank you for your patience and support with this, including doing all we can to be respectful and mindful of our neighbours and local community when considering making journeys to the school site.

Safeguarding informs so many of our daily actions; indeed it is our primary focus as we ensure the welfare and safety of our students. An example of this would be this week's all through staff meeting which focused, amongst other things, upon latest developments in safeguarding and various aspects of what we do including our recording and documentation. We are continuously reflecting so carefully on the culture and ethos we are building in order to always prioritise the wellbeing of every child and young person. It is part of all staff's daily practice and overseen by the safeguarding team who work together closely and meet weekly to discuss families who need support, and to reflect on all of our practice - always looking for new ways to improve.

Our passion in this area is something we are proud of but we realise that many of the things we are doing are not necessarily visible and therefore we will be sending out a half termly newsletter which will highlight some of the actions we have taken in response to parental comments, to provide the latest guidance on trends to help inform and guide parents or just to provide details from our own improvement plans. Our plans are always rooted in national guidance and with a great awareness of local concerns. The first news bulletin will be sent the last week of January to prepare for "safer internet day" on February 7th 2023.

Attendance matters

As we start the new school term, we are asking for your support in ensuring your child achieves 100% attendance - for the remainder of this academic year and future years. Regular school attendance will give your child the very best start in life, providing opportunities to learn, develop and succeed. Missing school could result in your child falling behind which could impact on their confidence, health and wellbeing.

This term the attendance team are launching a number of initiatives to promote and celebrate both excellent and improved attendance. This will include an attendance cup competition across all phases and rewards given linked to our values. We are also reviewing and embedding a new lates process to ensure students are punctual to school and in between lessons in the secondary phase.

There is also a wide range of support available to help you and your child achieve 100% school attendance, but please:

- Encourage and ensure your child attends school regularly and punctually
- Notify and discuss with your school of any concerns relating to school attendance at an early stage
- Notify the school immediately if your child is unable to attend school if they are unwell
- Maintain a regular routine bed-time and morning routine to help your child to get to school on time

We are concerned with the number of term time requests for holiday and I will be sharing in the coming weeks, information about the introduction of Fixed penalty notices.

Children only attend school for 190 days out of 365. This leaves 175 days for holidays. Avoid term time

holidays – these are unauthorised absences (unless in exceptional circumstances)

Let's all work together to make every day count and support your child to achieve 100%

Primary news

Learning in the Larch

learning! On Wednesday, I walked around the Larch and found such a wide range of lessons!
Reception have been learning about their literary canon text 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. They were discussing the different places the children go through and were sharing their opinions on the story! Year 1 were using chromebooks to explore a painting application to create a wonderful range of pieces! They were trying the different functions to create different effects.

The first week of term has been filled with so much

Year 2 were working in pairs to create fantastic gymnastics balances and shapes with their bodies. I was so impressed by their collaboration and support for each other!

Detailed drawings of close ups of flowers was happening in Year 3. The children told me how they were learning about the artist Georgia O'Keefe and how their drawings were similar to her pieces. Year 4 have been reading their literary canon text 'Journey to Jo'burg' and showing real maturity with asking questions and discussing parts of the text. Fractions have been the focus in Year 5 maths, with lots of practise of multiplying improper and mixed numbers with whole numbers. The children were really confident with explaining key vocabulary and their reasoning!

Year 6 have been learning about Goodnight Mr Tom and writing formal letters to contrast with their informal diary writing last week. They've really immersed themselves in learning about WW2 and applying their knowledge to their writing.

Year 2 dropping off/picking up points

Although the construction works are now complete for the Jubilee Suite, we have had overwhelming positive parental support for the new arrangements in place - particularly as Year 2 children are dropped/picked up in the same place as all other year groups. We will therefore continue with the revised arrangements rather than revert to the trim trail area directly outside the Year 2 classroom

doors.

Watches

A reminder to please ensure your child isn't wearing a smartwatch that connects to the internet at school. If your child is using a Fitbit to keep track of their steps, please ensure your child knows how to access the clock face so they aren't distracted when checking the time in class.

We highly recommend an analogue watch to support your child with learning how to read time. All rooms in the Larch have clocks.

KS2 break time snacks

Please ensure your child has a healthy snack for break times. This could be in the form of fruit, vegetables or something like breadsticks. These types of foods tend to ensure the children have more energy and focus for the remainder of the morning, compared to high sugar / less filling foods like biscuits or crisps. We thank you for your ongoing support.



Winter health update - January 2023

For parents/carers and education and childcare settings

As children return to schools and childcare settings, we expect to see many more cases of flu, COVID-19 and other infections that affect children's breathing (known as 'respiratory infections'). There also continue to be high numbers of scarlet fever cases, which can spread quickly, but can be easily treated with antibiotics. To help us through this term, this leaflet has five simple steps we can take to protect children, minimise the spread of illness in schools and childcare settings and protect others.



Stay home if unwell

Infections can spread quickly in schools and other childcare settings. If your child is unwell and has a fever they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and their fever has gone.

Adults should try to stay home when unwell and consider wearing a face covering to protect others if you do have to go out. Don't visit people in hospitals or care homes if you have a fever, a cold or symptoms of a stomach upset.



Keep hands clean

It is important to help children understand that keeping hands clean can stop bugs from spreading. Help your child wash their hands regularly at home with soap and warm water. More information here.



Catch coughs and sneezes

Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is a simple way to help stop illness from spreading. Keeping rooms well ventilated will also help prevent the spread of winter illness.



Get vaccinated if you're eligible

Now is a good time to check your you and your family's vaccinations are all up to date. If you are unsure your child has had all their routine vaccinations, you can check their personal health record (Red Book) or ask your GP. You can also check the childhood immunisation schedule online.

And it's not too late to get the free NHS flu jab or nasal spray this year if anyone in your family is eligible. The NHS will be contacting parents of children who have not yet had their flu immunisation. Flu nasal spray clinics are still taking place in some schools this month, or for children aged 2-3, please contact your GP to arrange an appointment.



Be scarlet fever aware

Call your GP for advice if you think your child has scarlet fever. More information about scarlet fever can be found on the <u>NHS website</u>. If you are concerned about a rash that your child has, advice is available here:
