Football news

Our Larch football team has been competing in the Hope cup since January. We are extremely proud of their achievements as they have qualified for the semifinals of this competition which involves all the local Hertford and Ware schools.

At secondary level four teams have qualified for the semi finals of the District Cup, this is our best showing in recent years. The following year groups have qualified;

- Year 8 (one game to play)
- Year 10
- Year 11
- Senior

Recently the Year 9 Boys beat Broxbourne School 3-1 but unfortunately with 2 wins out of three, it is not enough for a semi final place.

On Saturday 25th February Years 7-10 competed in our Saturday morning fixtures against Katherine Warrington school. Years 8 & 9 won and Year 7 & 10 narrowly lost. This Saturday we are due to play Roundwood Park with Years 8 & 10 at home and Years 7 and 9 away.


Volunteer Opportunities
