## Year 11 and Year 13

Our Year 11 and Year 13 cohorts have displayed so many of our SImon Balle values in this their final week of full lessons. We have been delighted to see the community ethos and spirit between friends; the fun of dressing up and games and more; the relationships between staff and students as all prepare for this next period; and the celebrations of all that has been achieved, pastorally and academically. Staff are looking forward to continuing to support each and every student during this period before and during exams, and we invite students and parents to stay closely in touch to ensure that every student is able to reach their highest aspirations. ## Change to lesson format

Once again the secondary phase needs to slightly tweak lesson formats during the day; the national examination timetable dictates the start time window and therefore we need to put in an earlier lunch. In practice this means: lesson 1, lesson 2 and break as normal but then following lesson 3 will be lunch. This means that there will now be two lessons in the afternoon. The start and end of the day's timings remain the same. This may be particularly important when arranging dental or medical appointments. This will run from Monday 15 May until Friday 23 June.

## **Careers update**

Over the past few months we have been delighted to welcome local businesses to our school to discuss their profession and opportunities within it, including apprenticeships. At the end of March we invited our local brewery, McMullen, to speak to two year groups about the hospitality business. It was great to hear about the variety of jobs, hours and shift patterns, career progression and avenues within this industry. It was also nice to hear students ask their own questions and, in a subsequent survey, 76% found the presentation really informative. More businesses will be visiting us very soon!

Y10 practice interviews - a big success!

At the end of April, all Year 10 pupils attended a mock interview. To prepare for this, students chose and applied for an "apprenticeship" then received an interview with feedback at the end. It was marvellous to see our school benefiting from the huge level of expertise and enthusiasm among our parent volunteers, to whom we owe considerable thanks.

Below are some of the responses we received from our interviewers:

"Just wanted to say how impressed I was with all the students I met with and how well they represented the school values. They were all fantastic ambassadors of the school who will present positively in any future interviews."

"Thanks for your email, it was an absolute pleasure to support the students today and I felt in a hugely privileged position to be their very first interviewer. I interviewed 5 students and I was extremely impressed with their confidence (once we got the nerves out the way), presentation, ability to articulate, respect and general attitude - a huge credit to you and the Year 10 team at Simon Balle. One student even gave me a stronger answer to a question than I have experienced in a real interview situation!

On reflection this year group has also had a number of key years disrupted by Covid, lock downs, home learning and bubbles, the impact of which was certainly not experienced today.

# Keeping safe in the community

**The Sandbox** is a new service within Hertfordshire. The service supports children and young people in with their mental health and wellbeing.

This free NHS funded service launched on 1 April 2023 and offers a website with access to games, worksheets, group chats and online events for children, young people, their parents/carers, teachers, and other professionals.

The Sandbox provides access to internet enabled Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (iCBT) or one to one support from professional therapists by text, phone online chat or video call, based on a triage of the person's needs.

Therapy sessions: 7am-10pm Mondays-Fridays and 10am-10pm Saturdays and Sundays

Live Chat: 10am-8pm Mondays-Fridays

Signing up is easy and doesn't require a referral from a professional.

Chat Health is a text messaging service for young people aged 11-19 years that runs between 9am-5pm, Monday to Friday and gives the opportunity to contact a School Nurse for support and advice.

Young people can ask for help and advice on a range of issues such as:

- Weight and exercise
- Healthy eating
- Stress and anxiety
- Relationships and sexual health

If a young person contacts Chat Health after 5pm or on weekends and bank holidays, they will receive a bounce back message explaining where they can access support.
