A capital letter must be used at the start of every sentence.	(CL)
A capital letter must be used for all proper nouns (such as for names of places, people, days or months).	(CL)
Every sentence must be punctuated clearly at the end (. ! ?).	P
Commas must only be used accurately. They do not replace full stops.	P,
Apostrophes must only be used to indicate possession (Tom's pen) or contraction (haven't).	(P')
Chosen tense (past, present, future) must remain the same throughout a piece of writing.*	T
Any information provided (names of authors, poets, playwrights, titles or any information displayed) must be spelt correctly.	(sp)
Paragraphs must be used.	(//
