Regular reminders will continue to be given about this via email. Anyone self-isolating with symptoms will be encouraged to access testing, and the school will help them do this. If a symptomatic person comes into school, they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up. Any student displaying symptoms or have a relative with symptoms will be isolated in the Conservatory until they can be collected. Any staff member or contractor will be required to leave the site asap. If someone is seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk then 999 will be called.  If a distance of 2m can't be maintained, supervising staff will wear a fluid-resistant surgical mask If contact is necessary, supervising staff will also wear disposable gloves and a disposable apron If there's a risk of splashing to the eyes, such as from coughing, spitting or vomiting, supervising staff will also wear eye protection Supervising staff MUST wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after the student has been picked up. If a student or a staff member working with students tests positive for coronavirus, the rest of their student group will be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 14 days (as will any staff member who looked after them in school while they were symptomatic).

Everyone will be encouraged to walk or cycle into school, and warned to avoid taking public transport during peak times.

For anyone who needs to take public transport, they'll be referred to government guidance.

If home to school transport will be running (i.e. buses), discussions will be held with the providers to make sure their staff:

- Follow hygiene rules
- Try to keep their distance from passengers where possible
- Do not work if they or a member of their household are displaying coronavirus symptoms

For students that will need to be dropped off and picked up, parents will be told through messages and signage:

- Their allocated drop off and collection times, with different student groups being given different times
- The protocols for minimising adult to adult contact - staff to enter school via the gate leading from the staff car park adjacent to Millennium Block (NOT the Visitor Car Park)
- all staff MUST handwash or hand sanitise upon entering any of the school buildings
- Parents are NOT to gather at entrance gates or doors

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Items that need laundering (e.g. tea towels) will be washed regularly in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, on the warmest water setting. These items will not be shared between washes.

Areas of the school that are used by students will be cleaned thoroughly at the end of the day.

Areas of the school not in use will be shut off to make cleaning more manageable.

Any equipment that is shared will be cleaned between groups of children using it and multiple groups won't use it simultaneously.

Shared rooms will be cleaned between different groups using them.

If a person with coronavirus symptoms comes into school, a deep clean will take place in the areas that the person has been in, following <u>decontamination</u> guidance.

Cleaning supplies will be topped up regularly and monitored to make sure they're not close to running out.

Teachers will wash their hands and surfaces before and after handling students' books.

	Students will be required to bring their own stationery and equipment to school. In the event of a student forgetting to bring in equipment, a pen/pencil will be provided and not required to be handed back in. Teachers may need to switch between groups/classrooms if subject specialism is needed. Teaching Desks in designated classrooms have been cleared and cleaned and MUST be maintained as a clean desk policy. 	Staff and contractors not working with student groups will be asked to maintain 2m distances from each other and from the student groups.

	Fire, first aid and emergency procedures have been reviewed to make sure they can still be followed with limited staff and changes to how the school space is being used. Areas in use will be well ventilated by opening windows or using ventilation units. Doors will be propped open, where fire safety and safeguarding wouldn't be compromised. Air conditioning units in any rooms within the school buildings can be used provided windows are to be opened to allow for natural air-flow. The use of lifts will be avoided unless essential (ie used by anyone with a recognised disability). Lifts will NOT be used in any fire evacuation event.
