Regular reminders will continue to be given about this via email.  Anyone self-isolating with symptoms will be encouraged to access testing, and the school will help them do this.  If a symptomatic person comes into school, they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up.  Any student displaying symptoms or have a relative with symptoms will be isolated in the Conservatory until they can be collected.  Any staff member or contractor will be required to leave the site asap.  If someone is seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk then 999 will be called. Spreading infection due to excessive contact and mixing between students and staff in classrooms	Students will be organised into year Group bubbles to reduce mixing between students.  ALL STUDENTS AND STAFF WILL ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING:  Space will be maintained between students, 1m apart where possible, with seats and desks arranged to allow this, and all forward facing.  Students are not permitted within the Teacher Zone at the front of each classroom.  The amount of take-home resources will be limited, Students will be required to bring their own stationery and equipment to school.  In the event of a student forgetting to bring in equipment, a pen/pencil will be provided and not required to be handed back in.  Teachers may need to switch between groups/classrooms if subject specialism is needed.  Teaching Desks in designated classrooms have been cleared and cleaned and MUST be maintained as a clean desk policy. Student groups will have staggered timetables, including for break and lunch times, to avoid too many students being in one place at the same time.			
Students will need to bring their own food and drink to school for the morning sessions, as canteen facilities are NOT available.			
Students will stay in the same classroom at the same desk throughout the day wherever possible.			
Students will be supervised at all times to ensure mixing between groups doesn't occur, and they will be reminded about the rules throughout the day.		October 2020 - ongoing	
Rooms will be accessed directly from outside where possible, and corridors have a one-way circulation route in order to keep groups apart.			
Toilet use will be managed to avoid crowding with students having different break times for using these facilities.			
Staff use of staff rooms and offices will be staggered to limit occupancy.			
Staff and contractors not working with student groups will be asked to maintain 2m distances from each other and from the student groups.			
Checks to the premises have been completed to make sure the school is up to health and safety standards before reopening.	B&FM	Still in force	
Each designated area has been checked for cleanliness and H&S regulations in accordance with COVID-19 guidance			
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	Fire, first aid and emergency procedures have been reviewed to make sure they can still be followed with limited staff and changes to how the school space is being used.  Areas in use will be well ventilated by opening windows or using ventilation units. Doors will be propped open, where fire safety and safeguarding wouldn't be compromised.  Air conditioning units in any rooms within the school buildings can be used provided windows are to be opened to allow for natural air-flow.  The use of lifts will be avoided unless essential (ie used by anyone with a recognised disability). Lifts will NOT be used in any fire evacuation event.
