





Towards the very end of the day the judges struggled as they sifted through the excellence that was presented to them. Nevertheless, they provided feedback to the groups and the result was,



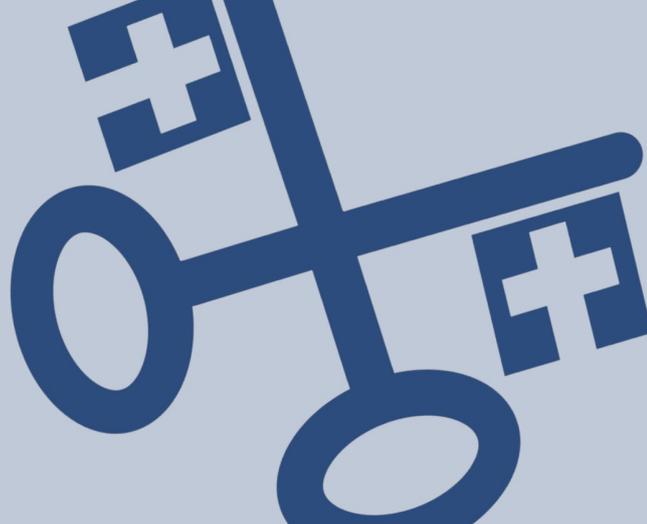

Student voice has been listened to, to determine the options on offer for both our Year 8 and Year 9 students as in the future, we will move towards a single options selection year.

This change has been to ensure that a greater depth of teaching can occur, beginning in Year 9, due to the increase of subject content that followed the Government's review of GCSEs, resulting in improved GCSE outcomes for the students.
