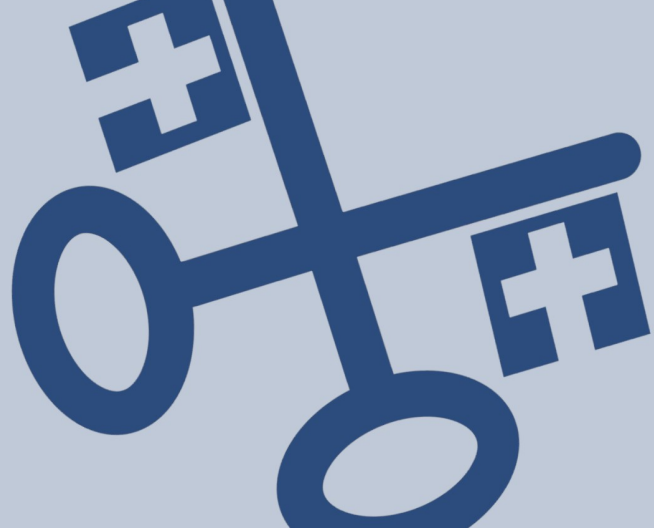

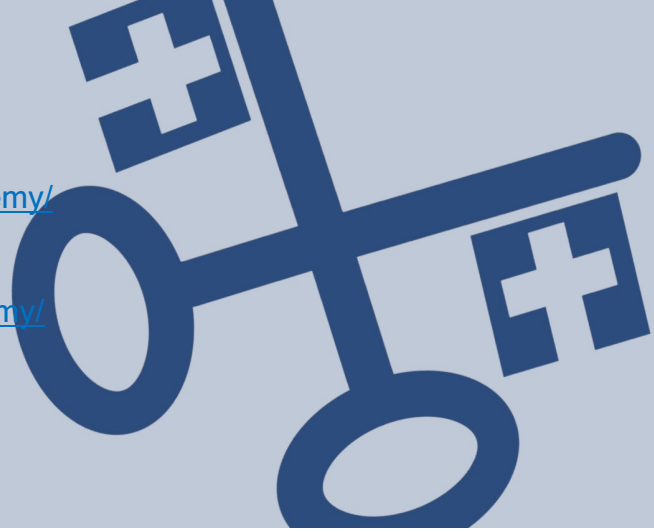

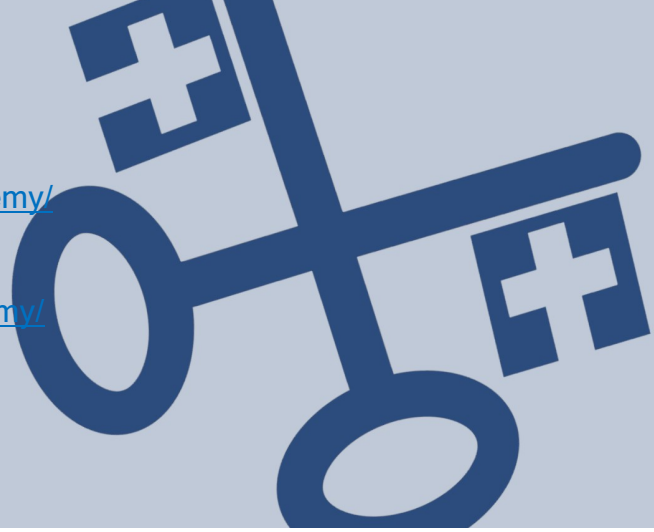

Plain black blazer with school badge sewn on

Plain black or medium grey v-neck pullover

Plain navy blue or plain black coat

Scarf - plain navy blue or black or school scarf

Patka/turban - (Sikh head covering) navy blue or black

Girls

Either:

Navy blue Trutex back vent skirt **or**

Navy blue Trutex flick pleat skirt **or**

Navy blue Trutex classic trousers (MUST be worn with a blazer). **Skinny fit trousers are not allowed**

Pink check, long sleeved blouse with round collar

Plain navy blue blazer (**NOT** black) with school badge sewn on (optional with skirt but compulsory with trousers)

Navy or white socks. Plain black/skin toned tights

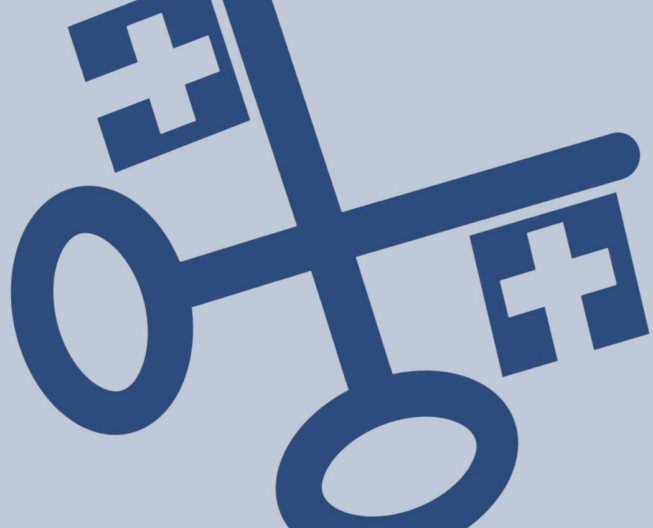
Smart, all black, leather, low heeled shoes.
