PE kit

In September, students will be required to attend the academy in their St Peter's Collegiate Academy tracksuit, polo t-shirt and suitable PE trainers on the day that they are timetabled to have their core PE lesson. They will have the opportunity to put on their shorts or skort at the beginning of the lesson. On their PE day, the PE kit will replace their School uniform and so the usual policy will apply if students are in incorrect uniform/kit.

This only applies to the day students have their core PE. Students who study GCSE PE or CNAT Sports Science should come to school in their normal uniform, unless advised by their PE teacher.

If students are attending an after school sports club, they should come to school in their normal academy uniform and then change into their kit at 3.00pm. By continuing this practice into the new school year it allows more time for physical activity during lessons and also we have had less unnamed kit and uniform being left behind after lessons.

Students will be advised of the days on which they need to bring boots, shin pads and gum shields.

All of the Academy kit can be purchased from Ron Flowers Sports in Queens Street. A new style of PE kit, manufactured by Surridge, has been introduced for the new Year 7 intake. Current students do not have to buy the new style of kit if they do not wish to. The new style of kit only needs to be purchased when students grow out of their current kit.

Jewellery and hair

During PE lessons all students must remove all items of jewellery, including watches and fitness watches, in order to keep themselves and others safe when participating. This is in keeping with safe practice guidance from the Association of Physical Education and the National Governing Bodies of the individual sports.

Students with long hair need to make sure it is tied back for the duration of the lesson.
