RAE-KWAN -My Time on BBC Two's The Choir

During the first lockdown I was lucky enough to have been chosen to be on BBC2's The Choir: Singing for Britain. This all started when my national choir director sent out a message about a multiscreen choir for us to take part in whilst we were stuck at home. So I filled in the application and had to send in a video of myself singing. A couple of days later I received a call from the production company and they informed me that they were very interested in the story as I was one of the youngest members of the cast. They interviewed me about my life pre pandemic and how I was finding the lockdown. A couple weeks later, three or four boxes of equipment were delivered to my house to borrow for the duration of filming.

The filming process was very weird as I would have to get up early to set up cameras etc and we would have the production team talking to us through a headset from their homes, watching us online and because I wasn't 18 at the time we could only record during school hours. All of my sessions with Gareth were done through a weblink which the production team has access to so they could record sound and videos. One of the things I will never forget is the sound checks at the start of every session; I would hear 'Lean on me'

playing through my in-ears and would be asked to sing along to it.

Over the 6 weeks of sessions I met five other people who were all having a different experience of lockdown and who were also writing songs with Gareth. In the end, Gareth invited them to collaborate on my song which made the song even better. Once the song was finished we then had to record it from our different locations around the country.

SPOTLIGHT ON MUSIC

Following the return to the music classroom just before Easter last year we are thoroughly enjoying being able to prioritise the practical elements of music that we had missed so much due to COVID restrictions. While it is fair to say that students are having to make up for lost time, students have demonstrated a really positive approach to these more practical based lessons.

In September we began a new approach to assessment in key stage 3 which means that students are given clear success criteria for each assessment so they can clearly see what their next steps are to improve during their preparation. These are provided in a booklet and students also track their musical skills on the ladders shown below. This takes into account both skills developed in the classroom and those outside the classroom such as in extra-curricular rehearsals or instrumental lessons

Year 7

Year 7 are spending the first half term developing a range of musical skills – keyboard skills, singing and arranging using Garageband software.

Year 8


Year 8 are focusing on a variety of musical styles from around the world during this first term. They have just completed a practical assessment based on Classical Indian music and will now be moving through other styles such as Bhangra, Samba and Reggae.

GCSE

GCSE students have been focusing on the Areas of Study - Year 9 on popular music, Year 10 on The Concerto and Year 11 recapping all of the Areas of Study in preparation for their mock alongside performance and composition coursework.

A number of our students experienced a very completed a successful weeks tour to Truro in August


to sing daily services in the cathedral in their role as members of the St. Peter's Church Choir. The standard of music making was fantastic and a lot of fun had by all.

- Spider diagrams to help form connections between points
- Online tests and guizzes to assess progress on specific modules or topics e.g. GCSE pod
- Working with a "study buddy" on a specific subject or topic
- Past papers to test exam technique and knowledge
- Online resources shared by teachers such as Google Classroom, GCSE Pod

STUDENTS TAKE A STAND ON GLOBAL WARMING

Caring for God's creation was the focus for members of St Peters Christian Union and Charity Team who met together to listen to ex-student Sandeep Bhardwaj and her colleague Lian Jacobs from the charity TEARFUND.

Students from years 7-13 heard about the work of TEARFUND and in particular the importance of living out our faith by taking a stand in looking after the planet and our global neighbours.

Sandeep and Lian explained how our lifestyle affects global warming which in turn causes life threatening circumstances for millions of people in poverty, who rely on growing crops to survive. "Those who contribute to the problem the least, are suffering the most" they stated.
