students that came to visit me having completed this ambitious reading challenge.

I had another insight into the power of reading this week, whilst teaching a Year 8 Drama lesson. The way that the class threw themselves into reading the scripts they had was astounding. The tone of voice, the emphasis on certain sections of the play and the intended volume levels showed a real understanding of audience.

There are reading opportunities throughout the curriculum and I would encourage everyone to try and support their children by opening up their minds in terms of reading resources. As a child obsessed by sport, I remember reading the newspaper from the back pages first, this love of sports writing never left me and even as a teacher I started every theory PE lesson with excerpts from the sports pages.

As we approach half term, I wanted to ensure that I remind everyone about uniform standards and punctuality once again. Often as schools approach the mid-point of the year students get a bit lackadaisical about both of these issues, so please support the school by reminding them about adhering to uniform requirements and emphasise the need to be on time for school. 


JASLEEN KAUR PHAGURA – YEAR 7
