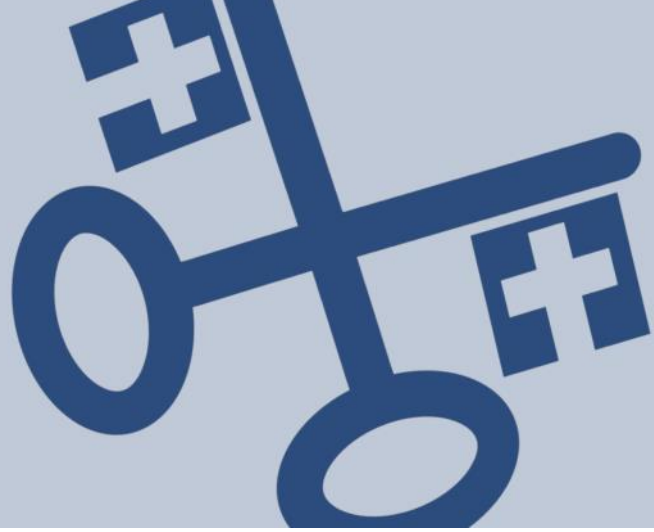

STUDENT BEHAVIOUR

Every child and every teacher at St Peter's has the right to be able to teach or learn in a calm environment free from disruption. After Easter we will be strengthening some aspects of our behaviour policy to address the behaviours of some students who disrupt lessons. In the new term, if a student disrupts a lesson they will receive a formal warning and if necessary a second warning which will be recorded on Class Charts. If the student does not respond to these warnings and continues to show disruptive behaviours they will be removed from the lesson and placed in a different classroom with a different teacher. When this happens parents will be notified via the Class Charts app and this removal from lessons will be recorded. We will monitor students who are removed from classrooms closely and further sanctions and interventions will be applied as required.

Behaviour points on Class Charts will be reset for students over the holiday. After Easter, behaviours and achievements will be awarded with a single positive or negative point. When a student reaches ten negative behaviour points parents will receive a letter explaining how the behaviour sanctions may escalate if behaviour does not improve. We will also explain what interventions may be appropriate for your child to support them in improving their behaviour. If a student reaches 15 points for negative behaviours they will be placed on a form tutor report. Again, you will be informed through the Class Charts app if your child is placed on report.

There will be further changes in the way we manage behaviour over the Summer term. We will continue to keep you informed of the changes we make and continue to work with parents to support students in addressing negative behaviours.

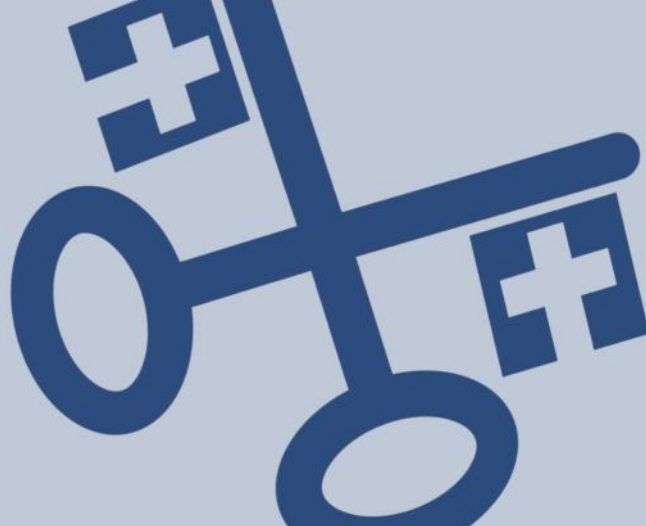
SAMOSA SALE SUCCESS

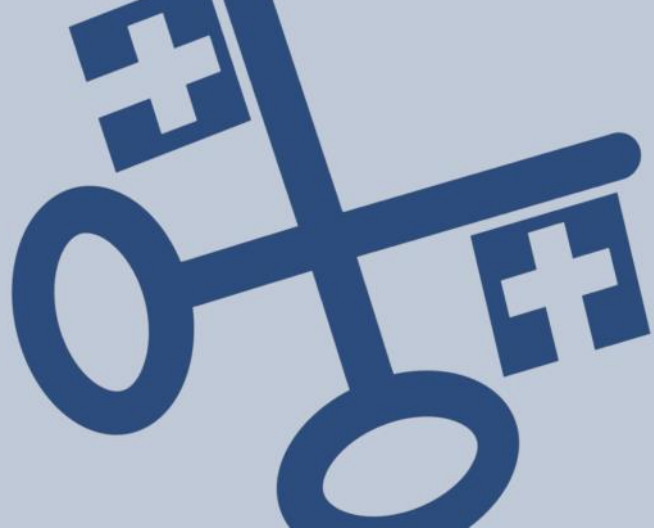
