



Principal's Message:

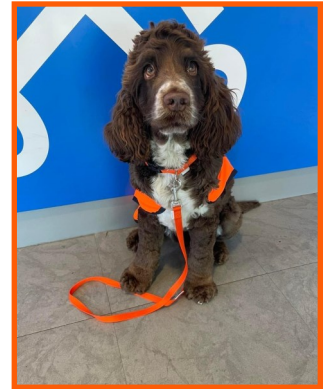

Academic Update - Behaviour

Congratulations to Year 8 who achieved 5773 positive behaviour points last half term - the highest number of all year groups. Congratulations also to 7KVE, 8PSM, 9LC, 10MBA and 11IH who achieved the highest number of positive behaviour points within their year groups. 93% of students in the Academy demonstrated consistently high standards of behaviour last term and stayed below the 10 point threshold for behaviour interventions and 73% of students achieved just one negative behaviour point or no points over the whole half term!

A great achievement and a number for us to increase!

Commonwealth Baton Event

On Thursday 19th May, I was selected, with a few other year 7 students, to carry the Wolverhampton Community Games Torch for St. Peters School. This torch was being used to represent the Commonwealth Games Torch and to raise awareness of the Commonwealth Games which are being held in Birmingham in July and August. The real Commonwealth Torch is travelling around the Commonwealth and each school who holds the torch has been allocated to a different Commonwealth country. We represented Uganda. We collected the torch from St. Michael's School (Zambia) who carried it along the old railway line. We brought it back to school and paraded it around the classrooms so everyone could see it. Finally, we hopped into the minibus and delivered the torch to Christ Church School where they created an archway with their arms for us to run through. I really enjoyed the experience and wish I could do it again. It has got me excited for the Commonwealth Games.
