## **Safeguarding**

You may have seen the tragic news last week of a young man who became another victim of knife crime in the city. This is the second incident in recent weeks. Of course our thoughts and prayers are with the victim's family and friends at this time. I thought it would be pertinent to mention to you all some of the steps that we are taking as a school to keep our students safe from these potential dangers. First of all, we are working with the West Midlands Violence Reduction Partnership, who are funded by West Midlands Police to reduce youth violence across the city. As a part of this collaborative relationship we had two speakers in school from the 'Precious Lives' project who used their own lived experiences to speak to the children about the risks of carrying knifes and being drawn into gang activity. The feedback from the students was overwhelmingly positive, so we will look to ask them to come into school again in the future.

Very recently we have purchased our own knife arch. This is a metal detector which will be on the gate on random mornings to ensure no such items are being brought onto the school site. In the past we have invited the police in to school to use their facilities, but we can now do this on a more consistent basis. Finally, this week, all students have had a session with Amani Simpson.
