



Post 16 Uniform



Rationale: Students from St Peter's and St Regis Wolverhampton will be moving between the two sites. Therefore uniform requirements must be consistent and sanctions applied consistently if there is an infringement.

Non-Negotiable: All students should wear a (purple) lanyard at all times: This is to ensure that students sign in/out and clearly identifiable.

Sixth form Uniform is Business dress. Sixth form students should be dressed smartly at all times. They are expected to represent the academy and set an example for the younger students, while expressing the privileges and responsibility of independent study. The Post 16 provision emulates a workplace and the uniform should reflect this. In order to maintain an appropriate dress code, the academy reserves the right to send home any student who fails to meet uniform standards.

- **Business style suit:** Colours should also comply with business style.
- **Cardigan or V neck jumper (optional):** Black or Navy with either V-neck or Crew neck. No Hoodies or jumpers with logos on.
- **White business shirt/blouse - Tie must be worn with shirt.**
- **Black polishable shoes:** No Trainers or casual style shoes.

General Appearance

- All student should dress with a level of formality and smartness le students should avoid clothing which is too informal e.g. Strappy tops, or tops which are low cut, tunic tops with leggings. Also be mindful of skirt length.
- Informal leisure clothing, which includes hoodies, leggings, shorts, tracksuits, jogging bottoms, should not be worn except during PE lessons if appropriate
- Ensure that clothing and/or personal appearance is appropriate and will not cause embarrassment or offence to others. Clothes should be non-offensive and contain no provocative logos or remarks;
- Ensure that clothing does not overexpose parts of the body (e.g. stomach or chest) or is transparent. Tight or revealing clothes, including mini-skirts, low cut tops or low waistlines are not considered appropriate for a professional working environment.
- Flip flops and sliders including crocs should not be worn while at the academy.
- Denim and leather should not be worn – this includes black denim and jeans style trousers (except on non-uniform days)
- Trainers should only be worn when involved in PE/sports activities or when appropriate for the role or specific duties, e.g. Educational Visits.
- Nails must comply with business style, colour and length and makeup must be discreet.
- No Hats/caps/Bonnets/Durag
- No Excessive jewellery (hoops, facial piercings) and any tattoos should be covered.

Equipment

Students should have all the necessary equipment, as bare minimum they will need:

- A folder for each subject, with dividers for each topic/teacher.
- A note book for class notes
- Pencil case with pen, pencil and ruler.

ICT Equipment

Students can bring their own electronic devices. (St Regis and St Peter's take no responsibility for these) Students can borrow a device from the respective academies if they wish.
