Catholic schools help their pupils grow by promoting the practice of attentive reflection and discerning decision making: in teaching, in the examen, prayer and retreats; and through the practice and example of school leaders and staff.

Prayer suggestions and activities:

- During November, the Month of the Holy Souls we pray for all saints who have died and gone to heaven and for all faithful departed who have died and are in purgatory. We give thanks for their example and witness of being attentive and discerning throughout their lives to their vocational calling. We join our prayers with the Communion of Saints Schools MAC and particular saints of this time e.g. St. Ambrose and St. John of the Cross.
- Pray for all leaders that they are attentive to the needs of those they serve when working together for positive outcomes for the people and for our common home. We especially pray for peace in our world at this time and especially remember all those who have died as a result of conflict during Remembrance Sunday, 12 November.
- Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (World Youth Sunday) November 26: Pray for all young people in the world that they continue to discern and reflect on how by serving others they are serving God.
- Read Mark 1:1-8 use Lectio Divina to help you to be more attentive and discerning of God's message.
- Pray for all as we prepare ourselves and the world for the Second Coming of Christ by using the Examen prayer to reflect on the choices we make and how we are attentive and discerning to God's call for each one of us. Examen Leaflet.pdf (jesuitinstitute.org)
