Dear parents/carers,

I hope that you are all enjoying the half term break. This marks the half-way point through the academic year — we have achieved many things and there is a lot more to come. In this newsletter I will inform you of some of the development work that we have been doing and will be asking for you to share your views and give support for some aspects/next steps.

I would like, however, to start with an expression of thanks for your contributions as a school community. You have given generously to a number of causes which impact both locally and internationally. The St Paul's Liturgical Leaders concluded their spending decisions with the World Gifts contributions. Due to your generosity, they managed to purchase:









This half term sees the start of Lent, another season of alms giving – more about this later on in the Newsletter.

Thank you also for the donations of **pre-loved uniform.** These are invaluable to families who require some additional support and also to replace lost items. Please can I remind you of **labelling all of your child's items regularly and frequently** (as they often wash out).

Thank you to those of you who replied to our **parent view survey**. The results were very useful in confirming what we do well but what we can also do better. One aspect on how to improve was the acknowledgement of cultural celebrations. This year has been more challenging than usual, even for the celebration of important aspects of the Catholic liturgical calendar, as many important festivals are falling in holiday time. This is also true of Holy week in the coming Easter break. However, we would like to invite you, as a community, to suggest which cultural festivals you would like to be shared with your children, i.e., Diwali, Holi, Chinese New Year, etc. Please complete the attached survey and we will respond to this moving forward. Where the festival occurs in the holiday, we will endeavour to mark this in the assembly before the celebration. We will create a **Cultural Celebration Calendar** in line with the cultural diversity of the community, which I will share with you in the Easter newsletter.



Another area of feedback which could have been more positive was the school's response to **bullying.** Whilst only 4 respondents expressed a negative view regarding this, we are not happy that any parents were left feeling as if any issues were unresolved. Therefore, I ask that should you feel that a concern that you have raised has not been responded to sufficiently, that you raise this through discussion or email – please do not wait until you are asked via a survey.

Finally, survey respondents suggested that they would like to know more about the **teaching of RE**. Last year we held a parent workshop with this focus. We will be offering this again on **Wednesday** 7<sup>th</sup> May at 1:40pm and will share the presentation with those who are unable to attend. This half term we are changing our approach to the teaching of RE. The Archdiocese of Birmingham has chosen St Anthony's as one of seven schools to pilot the new RE curriculum. The Religious Education Directory which underpins the curriculum has been rewritten and we are obliged to teach this from September 2026. We are working in advance of this to ensure that new proposals meet the requirements of being a pupil in a 1.5 entry school and we are delighted to be the only Wolverhampton School to have been invited to do so.

Aspects of the survey that parents rated highly included: being invited to support the prayer and faith life of the school, understanding the Catholic mission of the school, children being happy and doing well and being aware of what children are learning and how parents can help.







Polite reminder: Uniform Policy - Last term we saw increasing challenges to the Uniform Policy, particularly in relation to girls having lose hair and the use of coloured hair dye. As parents of older children, you may not be aware of some of this as your child may travel to school independently. We ask that the uniform policy is adhered to and that children are not encouraged to challenge it. When children reach Year 7, they are at risk of being sent directly home for breach of the uniform policy. Please help us to prepare the children for the transition to secondary school expectations. Reasons behind the need for hair to be tied back are (i) reduction of the spreading of head lice (we get these in every year group at some point during the year); (ii) health and safety in outdoor play and physical subjects, and (iii) a distraction to vision when hair is hanging in front of their eyes. Thank you for your support with this matter.



Live Simply Award – As you may recall, we have been working together to achieve the Live Simply Award for over a year now. Our achievements to date are as follows:

#### **GLOBAL IMPACT:**

- 1. CAFOD Pupils considered the impact of climate change and its negative impact on the crop industry and how this affected the income for the poorest families globally as part of the Step Up to The Plate campaign
- 2. CAFOD Fundraising for CAFOD, marked by a non-uniform date, focusing on global food poverty.
- 3. CAFOD Laudato Si assembly shared with children the need for us to be Stewards of God's planet and how the words of Genesis determine that this is our global responsibility. Pupils from across all roles and responsibilities explained how their work contributes to this.

#### LOCAL IMPACT:

- 4. Giving to the Local Food bank The Good Shepherd. Harvest donations have increased this year and the St Thomas More Ambassadors have been involved in packing and handing over these donations to the organisation. St Paul's Liturgical Leaders led the advertising and collection of toiletries for the Good Shepherd appeal for Fr Hudson's, where our community made a significant donation.
- 5. Establishing a link between the school's eco-work and that of the church: this area of the Live Simply plan has declined in action due to established links being lost with the change of Parish Priest. However, we did continue this work via the 'Keep Britain Tidy' campaign and we thank those of you who sent photos in for this. We ask that parents of Eco-Warriors support a community clean up event on TUESDAY 4th March to extend the impact of this work. An invite will be sent to the relevant people. Members of the wider Parish will also be invited to contribute.







6. Eco-Warriors sharing monthly tasks with the school community – this has been happening both in and beyond school. We are now extending this so that the monthly message is included in the Church Newsletter.

## **SCHOOL IMPACT:**

- 7. Eco-Warriors establishing recycling in our dinner hall. This had been done previously and then the use of the bins declined. This has been relaunched this half term, with the introduction of a new bin, shared through assembly. This is for pupils who bring packed lunches.
- 8. Peace Garden team The development of the peace garden has moved on, with plants becoming more established in this challenging area of school. Previously a waste plot, this is growing into a haven for insects, with symbols of faith reflected in its design. Mrs Geoghegan and a committed group of pupils tend to this area. It has its first snowdrop!








9. Growing understanding of our role as stewards of God's creation: Rise Theatre performed for the school in '22 and this acted as a springboard for the emphasis on this responsibility across areas of the curriculum, clubs and provision. The importance of looking after the environment is emphasised through Forest School teaching in Nursery, Reception and Y1 and through the Eco-Warrior club. The CAFOD Prayer for Earth is also shared as part of these assemblies.

## Forthcoming events:

Lent fundraising – this Lent we are supporting Father Hudson's Homes. As in a previous year, we will be putting one foot in front of the other to walk alongside the homeless and displaced families. On 11<sup>th</sup> April, we return to our 'Walk the Walk' campaign but this time with a focus on the Footprints poem/prayer:



We ask that families do the following:

- (i) Send a donation on the 'Walk the Walk' day, a minimum of £1 per child.
- (ii) Send photos of you and your children supporting this cause out of school, walking together, that you would be happy for us to share via Instagram. If you can get sponsorship and turn this into a personal challenge, that would be great. Your donations would be added to our total.

The Footprints prayer reminds us that when we are in times of trouble, God walks alongside us and at times carries us. We too can be the support for others by fundraising and walking in solidarity through this event.







## 65th Anniversary Celebration



We are planning a celebration event for our 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. St Anthony's Catholic Primary School opened in May 1960. We were due to celebrate in May 2020 but covid unkindly took this opportunity from us. In the initial planning stages, we are asking for anyone who would like to share photos/memories to send these in for display boards. We would also like any 'Look at Them Now' stories that you might have – stories of past pupils and what they have gone on to do. One of these pupils could be you!
