people: (1) the demographic shift from Mesopotamia to Canaan to Egypt motivated by <u>God's call of</u> <u>Abraham</u> (Genesis); (2) the <u>deliverance from Egypt</u> of the enslaved Israelites, their passage to freedom, and their			
formation as a people covenanted to God (Exodus); (3) the promise of Canaan and Israel's eventual possession of it. This ritual was performed annually as part of the Covenant renewal ceremony known as the <i>Feast of</i>			
Weeks [Pentecost: the fiftieth day after the Passover and the day after the Seventh Sabbath which ended the			
seventh week after Passover, thus giving it the name Feast of Weeks]. The people formally declared their loyalty to			
the Covenant with Yahweh. By this ritual of thanksgiving, they thanked God for the gift of the land, the abundance they enjoyed due to God's provident care, and the gift of freedom. As Christians entering the Lenten season we			
thank God for (a) <u>a new exodus</u> , i.e., a new passage from slavery to freedom, from death to life; (b) a <u>new and</u> <u>eternal Covenant</u> sealed with the blood of Jesus on the cross; (c) <u>a new manna</u> in the gift of the Eucharist; (d) a <u>new</u>
