Prayer suggestions and activities:

- During the month of the Sacred Heart (June), use images of the Sacred heart to pray using the 'Visio Divina'. There is a useful 5 step guide here: https://www.pbrenewalcenter.org/blog/contemplative-prayer-thefive-steps-of-visio-divina/
- Pray the prayer to the Holy Spirit. May we use our gifts and fruits to bring hope to the world.
- Especially on the Feast of the Dedication of the Cathedral Church of St. Chad (Wed 18), pray that our Church within the Archdiocese of Birmingham will continue to grow and bring faith-filled hope to all, so all can flourish.
- We pray for Pope Leo especially around the Solemnity of SS Peter and Paul. That he may continue to strengthen and protect the Church both now and for the future.

Linking Faith-filled and Hopeful to scripture, meaning and teachings of the Church, Pope Leo XIV and the Saints.

Scripture to Explore:

Luke 9:11-17 Use this scripture to explore the faith the disciples had in lesus that he would be able to provide for all.

Link this to Jesus caring about our needs. Jesus didn't just give 'enough', he gave 'more than enough' so there were leftovers!

Activities and Questions: -

- Explore various images from around the world that depict the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Explore the story of the Sacred Heart and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque - discern how this shows being faith-filled and hopeful.
- Listen to 'Come Holy Spirit' by OneLife Music https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v=Ya-QpkltH7M How can the gifts of the Holy Spirit be used to help us grow in our beliefs and to be hopeful
- Debate: Faith, hope and love are the theological virtues. If we live these out, the world would be a better place for all.

- Does your school give hope by persistently building up the faith of pupils in themselves and in others? How do you build community?
- How do you notice when pupils lack faith and hope? And what do you do about it?

Linking Faith-filled and Hopeful to the way we can choose to live our lives to serve God and to serve others.

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Activities and challenges:

- Create your own image of the Sacred Heart. Use OneLife Music's https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=znKrahGiYfw -'A Heart that Sees' to consider how to 'see' those that lack hope. How can we plan to bring hope to others.
- Use the 'Pilgrims of Hope' logo to create cards and letters for those in a local care home.
- Send a card to thank someone who shows how to live being 'faithfilled and hopeful'.
- Draw round a pupil children write on the hands; how they can help others, the feet; go where is needed, the heart; how to show love to others and the eyes; noticing those who are left out or excluded.
- Create a classroom Bingo board with actions like, say a kind word, help without being asked, pray for someone or encourage a friend. Each child must try to complete a full board over a week.
- Y6 children to write a letter to Y5 children, explaining what being a Y6 child is like. Use words and phrases to offer hope for the future
- Use the Pope's prayer intention for June: That the world might grow in compassion to reflect upon how this can be passed onto others.
