Home schooling

We would all like to stay as fit and well as possible, so we understand that parents may keep their children at home for a few days with a bad cold in case further symptoms develop, or children may need to be self-isolating, for example if a close contact needs to have a COVID test. Please keep in touch with school during the absence and inform us of the results of any tests.

If your child is staying at home, and is well enough to do some school work, we recommend that you access **Oak Academy**, which has Maths, English and one other subject for each day of the week. Lessons are often presented as a 15 minute video which can be paused whilst the child follows the instructions of the real teacher presenting the lesson, just like in the classroom.

You can start at Monday, whatever the day of your absence, and access the previous week's lessons if you need to by searching your child's year group .

Nursery children should follow Mrs Turnbull's advice on Tapestry if they need to stay at home.

Remember to read to your child, and online access to our new reading scheme will be supplied by your child's class teacher via Seesaw.

Talk to your child and involve them in the activities you are doing, cooking, cleaning and gardening etc. Take the opportunity to tidy their bedroom!

If you're watching TV or a film together, talk to your child about the setting, characters, make predictions and so on, as you would if reading a book.

In addition, your child will be able to complete the weekly homework tasks set by their teacher. If you require further advice, send the teacher an email via the school office.
