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The risk assessment has been consulted on with trades unions and staff and training has been provided on implementing the actions. The actions are monitored to ensure effective outcomes are achieved. Feedback from the monitoring is fed into the weekly review. The risk assessment has also been reviewed by governance volunteers and is published on the school website for parents to consider. The risk assessment will be reviewed, updated and communicated as the circumstances in our school and the local community and public health advice change.

Context		The government continues to manage the risk of serious illness from the spread of the virus. Step 4 marked a new phase in the government's response to the pandemic, moving away from stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people on how to protect themselves and others, alongside targeted interventions to reduce risk. As COVID-19 becomes a virus that we learn to live with, there is now an imperative to reduce the disruption to children and young people's education - particularly given that the direct clinical risks to children are extremely low, and every adult has been offered a first vaccine and the opportunity for 2 doses by mid-September. Our priority now therefore is to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils. The evidence is clear that being out of education causes significant harm to educational attainment, life chances, mental and physical health. School attendance is mandatory for all pupils 5 years and over and it is our priority to ensure that as	
		many children as possible attend regularly. We have produced this risk assessment based on <u>DfE guidance dated 17th August 2021.</u>	
Infection - both to individuals and across a large group of staff and students and onward		No-one is to enter school premises if they have any symptoms of Covid-19, have had a positive test result or should be self isolating (see below for detail). They must stay at home and follow government guidance	
	Space	Pupils will be organised as they were prior to the pandemic and will no longer be kept in consistent 'bubbles'. However the guidance requires us to 'make sure your outbreak management plans cover the possibility that in some local areas it may become necessary to reintroduce 'bubbles' for a temporary period, to reduce mixing between groups'. Bubbles may therefore be temporarily created as and when required to meet the local need for increased infection control.

isolation	We will work closely with NHS Test and Trace when contacted by them, but will no longer undertake contact tracing. Close contacts from school (pupil or staff) will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. Pupils/staff are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:
	they are fully vaccinated
	 they are below the age of 18
	 they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons
	Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We expect everyone to take a PCR test if advised to do so.
	Staff who do not need to isolate, and children who have been identified as a close contact, should continue to attend school as normal. We will ask staff who live with someone who has tested positive to carry out a LFT each day to protect ongoing risk in school. They do not need to wear a face covering within the school, but it is expected and recommended that these are worn when travelling on public or dedicated transport.
,	Face coverings will no longer be a requirement for pupils, staff or visitors either in classrooms or in communal areas, however they may be worn if preferred. Should there be an increase in the number of positive cases in school PHE may advise that they need to be temporarily worn to control infection levels.
1	Our <u>Contingency Outbreak Management Plan</u> outlines what we would do in the event of positive cases and outlines how we would operate if we were advised to take extra measures to help break chains of transmission.
1.Hand	Regular hand washing for 20 seconds with soap and running water is our preferred control method regarding hand hygiene. Hand sanitiser is applied at intervals between hand washing to maximise infection control and staff/visitors will use hand sanitiser on entry to the building.
1 ' '	Tissues available in every classroom for coughs, sneezes, runny noses along with a lidded bin for safe disposal. 'Catch it, kill it, bin it'.
I	PPE will no longer be needed beyond what staff would normally need for their work eg gloves & apron needed in EY for changing nappies. This is not a requirement, but it is available should staff wish to wear it.
	Our cleaning team will thoroughly clean school each evening after school when the majority of children have departed and will adhere to <u>Trust cleaning standards</u> .
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• Blue roll and disinfectant spray will be used by classroom staff to sanitise surfaces before and after use throughout the day as required • Wipes at photocopiers to enable cleaning after each use. • SBM carries out cleaning spot checks and feedbacks results to cleaners with increased monitoring of any areas of concern Ventilation We will ensure that school is well ventilated: • Corridor doors will be held in the open setting. • At least 2 windows will be opened to about 5cm to allow internal air to exchange with fresh external air when the room is occupied by more than one person regardless of whether heating is on or not. Several windows will be opened in larger rooms. • Heating will be used as necessary to ensure comfort levels are maintained. DfE will issue schools with Co2 monitors to schools in the Autumn Term 2021 We will balance the need for increased ventilation with the need to maintain a comfortable teaching environment and will refer to HSE guidance to support us in this process. Responding to an individual When a staff member or child develops symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, a loss or change with symptoms or a positive to sense of smell or taste) or has a positive test, we will follow public health advice on when to self isolate and test result. what to do. Anyone who has tested positive will self isolate • Close contacts of someone who has tested positive will NOT self isolate if they o are fully vaccinated (14 days have passed since 2nd dose) or they are under 18 or • they're taking part in a vaccine trial or • they're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons Regardless of whether they have symptoms or not close contacts will book a PCR test here Any pupil that shows any possible symptoms of Covid-19 is to be immediately isolated from their classmates and mask donned by the staff member. The child will then be taken to the isolation room, the window opened and parents contacted so they can be removed from the site.

Staff members are to inform the school office that they are leaving the school site should they show any symptoms of coronavirus. They should not come to the office or walk around school, but leave by the nearest exit. They should avoid public transport for their journey home.

Should an individual who is suspected of having coronavirus need to use toilet facilities before leaving the building these will be cleaned using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.

Asymptomatic testing

Staff lateral flow testing has been paused over the summer holidays, but participating staff should carry out a test the day before returning for the new academic year and twice weekly until the end of September when the

		Staff with a positive lateral flow result will inform the headteacher immediately, self isolate in line with stay at home guidance and obtain a PCR test to check if they have Covid-19.
