EYFS

It has been another exciting half term in the Early Years at Stobhillgate.

In Nursery we started the term reading, The three Little Pigs. It was a fantastic opportunity to explore different materials as part of our 'Design and Technology' week. We built three houses, one made of straw, one made of sticks and one

made from bricks. Then we used a hairdryer to investigate which material was the strongest. Everyone really enjoyed taking turns to hold the hairdryer and blow the houses down. We now know that brick is definitely the strongest of the three materials.

Reception have enjoyed our project, "Where did Goldilocks go next?". We have read various traditional tales including, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs and The Little Red Hen. We have received letters from the Three Pigs and Little Red Hen and a video from The King of Fairytale Land. The project gave purpose to our writing as we created 'Wanted' posters, wrote letters to fairytale creatures, and wrote a short storybook about where she had been. We have learnt about the importance of maps and created our own maps of 'Fairytale Land' to help us guess where Goldilocks might be. It has been exciting and enjoyable investigating what Goldilocks has been up to but it came to the end when the giant from Jack and the Beanstalk chased her home. We finished our project by making our own bread, just like the Little Red Hen and enjoying a slice of freshly baked bread outside in the sun. In Maths we have started finding the answers to various number sentences and the children are

thoroughly enjoying making their own number sentences and working out the answers.

Forest School has been full of adventures and we have enjoyed using our imagination to make our adventures come to life. Our learning has been focused around, 'Stanley's Stick'. A story about a boy and his stick and all the things it can be. The children have each collected their own stick, they have learnt how to tie knots using rope to turn their sticks into rafts.

As we come to the end of this half term we have thoroughly enjoyed learning about our Queen and her 70 years on the throne. The children have been reading, 'The Queen's Knickers' which has made everyone smile. We have taken the opportunity to learn more about London and have really enjoyed virtually seeing the sights. We look forward to celebrating!







Year 1

Wingrove Primary School

One of the highlights of this half term was our wonderful trip to Wingrove Primary School in Fenham, Newcastle. This trip allowed our children to work alongside and get to know children who have a very different cultural background and very different beliefs to our children. This helps our children have a wider tolerance, understanding and acceptance of people who are different to them. We have already exchanged letters with each other and Wingrove will visit us in July. This relationship will continue next year too as the children grow up together.



Perfect Plants

This half term we have been learning about the structure of plants, including the roots, stem, leaves and flower. We have found different plants around the school grounds and looked and the different parts and named them. Maybe at home you could do the same in your garden, or the local park? We have also learnt the names of some plants you might find in a garden like tulips, lavender, sunflowers, daffodils and roses.

Another wonderful part of coming to our school is the opportunity our children get to participate in forest school. We are very lucky to have Mrs Bush who leads these sessions in school where the children develop their skills from Reception to Year Four. This half term the children have been using loppers to cut down branches and whittling pieces of wood to create woodland characters.

River Safety

In our English lessons we have been innovating a warning story that involves the main characters being warned not to go near a river. During our writing, we have not only been working hard to improve our handwriting, capital letters and full stops, but we have also been learning about adjectives and similes.

Year 2

I would like to start by saying how very proud I am of each and every child in my class. They have worked exceptionally hard all year; however I was blown away by how focused, determined and calm they were as we completed the SATs over the last few weeks. What a class full of super stars I have!

This half term has been another action packed one. We returned after the Easter holidays to DT week. The children made some colourful pouches for this project. This required resilience, patience and precision from the children, and once again they delivered. It was wonderful to watch as the children supported each other in their learning; helping with cutting and threading, and in some cases modelling how to sew a running stitch to their peers. As a result, the finished products looked amazing!

We also went on our school trip to the Zoo during the first week back. This trip was linked to our learning of Hot and Cold places in Geography. The visit was exciting and engaging, and not only did the children get to see the animals, they also got to hold some too. Every child behaved impeccably on this visit, proudly representing Stobhillgate First School.

Back in the classroom, we have been writing warning tales in English. We used the model text 'Man Mountain' and created our own version of the story. The children took great pride in their writing, including lots of wonderful vocabulary and punctuation, and they were very excited to be able to show their books to you during our 'open classroom'. In maths the children were learning how to measure different lengths. These lesson allowed for lots of practical exploration of objects around the school. The children had lots of fun trying to estimate the length of a metre, and making comparisons.



I hope you have a lovely week off, and I look forward to welcoming the children back for our final half term!

Year 3

This half-term, we kicked off with DT week during which the children made some impressive volcano/earthquake themed cushions using techniques such as: applique, running stitch and cross stitch! The children all had lots of fun whilst recapping knowledge from their Geography unit!

Our current unit sees us delving into the world of warning tales. Miss Hennessey

has been working hard with the children to establish the structure of these and what language features we can use to ensure that they are successful in creating suspense and intrigue for the reader. In the picture below, you can see the children orally retelling the story through a Talk 4Writing approach.

Telling the time is always a tricky one. We approached this in a different way this half-term to help the learning 'stick'. We got up, active and used concrete manipulatives to create a clock and visualise what it all means and what differing times look like. We started by recapping o'clock, quarter and half past before moving onto telling the time to 5 minutes and 1 minute.



Year 4

What a half term! It may have been a shorter one, but it has certainly been jam-packed!

The term started with DT week, our focus being on textiles. Year 4 children designed and made book covers.

Robin Wood was fantastic! Children enjoyed 3 full days of activities from zip wiring through the trees, to taking on the dreaded piranha pool! We all had a fantastic time and came home very tired but with lots of stories

to tell. Miss Owens, Mrs Bush and Mr Henderson were so proud of the exceptional behaviour, the amazing teamwork and the courage of every single child who pushed themselves beyond their comfort zones.

You may remember making uniform donations this time 2 years ago – Our donations were gratefully received by Linda Community School in Zambia, organised through a charity called the Zambezi Sunrise Trust.



At the end of last half term, children in Year 4 wrote letters to the children in Zambia. John, a trustee for the Zambezi Sunrise Trust, visited school this week to deliver a whole school assembly and to distribute much anticipated replies to our letters! We hope to continue this link into the next academic year.










You can begin ordering uniform for the next school year from <u>Tots to Teams</u>.


Pupil Achievements
