Nursery and Reception have had a busy few weeks in school. We have been reaping the benefits of our planting earlier in the term during Forest School. Nursery took home bean plants which have now grown enormous! It has been fantastic to see how well children have looked after their plants at home. Reception planted radishes in the reception garden and harvested them earlier this month. There were mixed reactions when we tasted them!

It was fantastic to welcome the families of the children in Nursery and Reception into our school this month. The stay and play sessions were an excellent opportunity for families to come and see the amazing progress all of the children have made this year. It was lovely to see so many families joining us to play and create together. Children were able to show their families the skills they have developed in their writing, communication and cooperative play skills.

Recently in Nursery, the children have particularly enjoyed accessing the reading area and showing their knowledge of previous core books. It has been great to see how confident the children are becoming at retelling their favourite stories to both their friends and the adults in the classroom.

Reception have been on a fantastic learning journey throughout their time in Early Years, particularly in their writing journey. The children have all worked exceptionally hard to transfer their phonic reading skills into their writing. Recently, after learning about how we change as we grow older and learn new skills, the children thought about their ambitions for the future. They were able to use their writing skills to record their wishes for the future.

Transition day for both the Nursery children moving to Reception and the Reception children moving to Year 1 went extremely well. The children enjoyed spending time in their new classrooms and working with their new teachers. It has been fantastic to see how much the children in Early Years have developed during this year and we look forward to seeing this continue next year.

Over the summer, you may wish to revisit this learning. You could have lots of fun creating some simple instructions for your child to follow to get them from A to B!

I have loved getting to know each and every child in Year 2 and I will miss them dearly. They are an enthusiastic, engaging and hardworking group of children, and I am incredibly proud of everything they have achieved this year.
