Dressing to reflect the professional nature of our work is essential.

Male Staff - excluding Technicians and Premises team

Suit or jacket and trousers
Shirt and tie

Male Staff –Technicians

Smart trousers and shirt
Protective clothing should be worn when working in practical situations
White coats or overalls will be provided on request

Male Staff – Premises team

Plain trousers or shorts (just above knee)
Uniform polo shirt
Uniform fleece
Waterproof coat for outdoor work will be provided
Protective clothing should be worn when working in practical situations
Hard hats, safety boots and other PPE will be provided

Female Staff – excluding Technicians and Premises team

Suit or jacket/trousers, jacket/skirt, smart dress
Smart blouse or shirt

Female Staff – Technicians

Smart skirt or trousers
Smart blouse or shirt
Protective clothing should be worn when working in practical situations
White coats or overalls will be provided on request

Female Staff – Premises team

Plain trousers or shorts (just above knee)
Uniform polo shirt
Uniform fleece
Waterproof coat for outdoor work will be provided
Protective clothing should be worn when working in practical situations
Hard hats, safety boots and other PPE will be provided

What is unacceptable?

Casual clothes such as:

Jeans
Shorts
T-shirts and vest tops
Trainers
Flip flops
Denim and other leisure materials
Visible bra straps
Low cut tops
Facial piercings and visible tattoos
