UNIFORM: There are still a few pupils who are not wearing the correct uniform to school. We ask all parents and carers to work with us to ensure the pupils come to school in the appropriate uniform to ensure the sense of community is promoted.

If your child has a sensory sensitivity to any of the clothing that is the school uniform, please let us know and we will work with you to find an alternative solution that is more appropriate for your child.

ATTENDANCE: Can we remind parents and carers that holidays during school time are NOT authorised and parents who take their children out persistently will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer. There is an expectation that pupils attend school, the more they are in school the better progress is. This is a long established piece of research.



We understand there are complex issues around some of the young people we work with and Mrs Huseyin will lead any support you require. Ultimately the school will work with families and individuals to support the best attendance we can for each pupil.

Every case is treated fairly and individually. Supporting complex circumstances is not comparable to families going on holiday and so we will address unauthorised reasons for absence seriously. This will also include extended periods of sickness and low level frequent absence.

Primary News from Mr Mills

This term's topic has been Food in the Primary department. The pupils have been learning about lots of different types of food and even getting the chance to taste and experience them.



We have been working with Tottenham Hotspur Foundation this term. Connor is a specialist sports coach that comes to teach and help develop the pupils gross motor and sporting skills in a fun and exciting way.









During the half-term break we had two fantastic rooms fitted in The Grove. We now have a sensory room and a soft-play room. As you can see, the primary pupils love to explore and learn in these fun and exciting spaces.





Circle Class

This term our topic was 'Food'. In Circle class we have been exploring different food items. During our cooking sessions we all requested, made and ate our bread and Gingerbread man cake. All the students have enjoyed exploring and learning about different foods through our multi-sensory lessons. In Maths, we have been learning about lengths and sizes. In addition, we have been learning 1 more and 1 less from the number given, as well as quantity to numeral. In English, we have been reading 'The Enormous Turnip' and 'The Gingerbread Man'. We have been learning how to write simple sentences and when to use capital letters.

As a class, we have been working really hard on our communication which includes using PECS and Makaton, we have also been working hard to recognise when we need a break and request it. All students have made fantastic progress within the first term. Well done!!















City Class

City class has made a lot of progress this term. We have settled in class following routines and we have learnt through fun lessons. This term in our food topic we have learnt about shapes by using shaped food. We have read two stories: Bonfire Night and Maisy's birthday. Our functional activities (setting up tables, making breakfast) have really helped to provide meaningful balance and core learning. Great job! We wish you all a well deserved break and a happy Christmas!



Victoria Class

This half term the students have settled well into the class routines and made great strides in their social and self help skills, such as greeting, getting changed and using cutlery.

In maths the students have been learning counting and one-to-one correspondence through number action songs, puzzles and table activities. They have been sorting and matching 2D shapes, sorting into colours and learning about size.

In literacy we have been learning around the two sensory stories 'Bonfire Night' and 'The Enormous turnip' as well as 'Frozen'. The children have been learning to match pictures and have taken turns acting out parts of the stories. We have continued to make marks using different mark making tools and to form shapes and letters.

In art the children have created seasonal craft such as

pumpkins and snowflakes from paper mache and cotton and in cooking they have been pouring, measuring and mixing to create different types of doughs.

In our PE sessions the children have been following circuits to learn how to jump over hurdles, balance on beams and throw bean bags into hoops.

Next term, the topic will be 'Materials'.

Metropolitan Class

Metropolitan have been progressing in various subjects. In History we have been studying the Industrial Revolution and WWII; in Science we have been developing our practical skills; in English we have been studying A Monster Calls novel; in Art we have been creating Stop Motion animations and building Winter Show Props (including a fabulous Tinman costume, well done Rafael!); and in Food Tech we have been cooking delicious meals!

Bakerloo Class have had an amazing first term at The Grove. Our topic this term has been 'staying safe' which has helped us to include life skills in all areas of the curriculum. We have made beautiful safety books for bonfire night and have really enjoyed learning about safety in the kitchen when cooking delicious healthy snacks! We were all very proud of the winter performance too, what a lovely way to end the term!











Central


This term Central class has settled into the new school and all students have made great progress. They have enjoyed using the new facilities such as the trampolines, swing and water play room. They have been working hard in all areas to develop their skill sets and independence with a main focus on communication and social skills. The topic this term was dinosaurs which we embedded it across all key learning areas such as English, Maths and Science. The highlight of our term was making a paper mache volcano and conducting a science experiment to watch it explode.

Jubilee

Jubilee class has been eager to learn new things in English, Maths, Geography and DT. Our topic this term was Extreme Earth and in our Geography lessons we have been learning about the main layers of the earth, tectonic plates, tornadoes, earthquakes and volcanoes to understand our planet better.

In English we have been using adjectives to describe pictures of the extreme phenomena and explored but also wrote our own newspaper articles and diary entries. During our library sessions we practise reading a book independently and writing a book review.







Moreover, during our Phonics sessions we learnt about various phonemes, how to pronounce them and practised how to write those sounds. During circle time we sorted consonants and vowels and had to think and write words beginning with those letters and sounds.



For D&T we looked at different building structures and created our own Earthquake proof buildings using various techniques such as cross braces or a pendulum. We practised our problem solving, social interaction and team work skills. A lesson that we all enjoy is Food Tech and this term we have started using the oven to bake various easy and quick snacks such as tortilla chips, tortilla pizza, biscuits with lemon zest etc. We practised out cutting, spreading, mixing skills as well as following a recipe and tidying up our equipment.



Finally, as a class we love PE and Dance lessons and we've worked very hard in both lessons, in order to achieve the challenging sport techniques for Hockey and Football and complicated dance routines for break dance, therefore we are very proud of our accomplishments.





In Maths we have been learning about place value, subtraction of 2-digit numbers and self-assessed our work using calculators. We have also started looking at word problems and continued to develop our addition skills through our lessons on Money.





We have built strong foundations to start creating healthy and friendly relationships with our peers and we enjoy spending time together. Happy holidays and a happy new year!

Piccadilly Life skills

This half term has been full of new experiences. Piccadilly class have been going out to the park every week and have now started going to the shop to increase independence and life skills. We have been learning about safe travel, shopping skills, making a shopping list, then looking for the items in the shop and then handing them out at the till.

During life skills sessions in school, we have been learning about hygiene and how to keep ourselves clean. Piccadilly class has been learning how to do their laundry and wash their swimming trunks and towels after water play.

During snack time, everyone has been practicing different skills such as laying the table, tidying the table, washing and drying up the dishes and putting dishes away. They all have done extremely well!



Mathematics

In maths, we have been learning about numbers and addition and subtraction using a variety of resources such as paint and sensory objects. We have done lots of different fun activities such as throwing balls to a dartboard and adding a specific number of blocks to towers.



English/ PSHE/ Topic

This term, our topic has been around extreme Earth conditions. We have been looking at tornados, volcanos, earthquakes and tsunamis. The students have made different crafts to represent each of them and learned about their effects on Earth.

In PSHE we have been learning about emotions, how to recognize them in others and in ourselves. We have introduced the zones of regulation and everyone has been really engaged with learning about them through a wide range of activities. We have been acting out emotions and looking at pictures and videos. We have also been learning about private and public places.





Post 16 News from Ms Elton

I can't believe that we are nearly at the end of our first term, in the new school, in the new building! It has been a brilliant first term for all of post 16 students. I have enjoyed seeing all of their hard work across their subjects: particularly seeing their progress with life skills in the life skills flat.
