<p>What is it?</p>	<p>Illustrators are paid to create still drawings and images to communicate a story, message or idea, which are then used in advertisements, books, magazines, packaging, greeting cards and newspapers.</p>
<p>Where do you do it?</p>	<p>Most illustrators are freelance. They can work anywhere as long as they have the correct equipment.</p> <p>Areas of work include: Posters, books, magazines, newspapers, comics, fashion, greetings cards, calendars, t-shirts, TV, film, computer games, websites, apps and animation.</p>
<p>Skills you need.....</p>	<p>Creativity, organisation, good communication, good time keeping and the ability to work independently or and in a team.</p>
<p>What days / hours do you work?</p>	<p>To establish and maintain your reputation, you must keep to deadlines. This may mean working long hours, weekends and/or evenings to deliver a brief.</p>
<p>Useful qualifications or interests</p>	<p>Qualifications are less important than a talent for illustration, the ability to promote your work and a good portfolio.</p>
<p>What do you get paid?</p>	<p>Most illustrators work on a freelance basis, so salary figures are hard to estimate it will depend on the client. Starting salaries should be around £23,000</p>
