































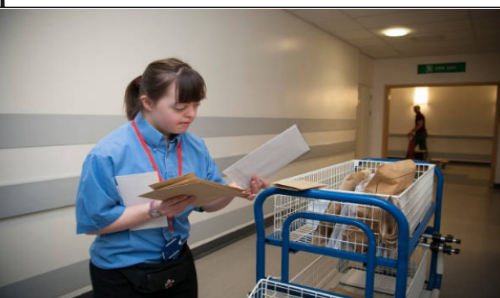


# Job of the week

<p><b>? What is it?</b></p>	    <p>Hospital porters move patients, equipment and medical supplies around a hospital.</p>
 <p><b>Where do you do it?</b></p>	   <p>You could work in an NHS or private hospital</p>
  <p><b>Skills you need.....</b></p>	    <p>Patience, Good communication, a caring nature and the ability to work well with others</p>
  <p><b>What days / hours do you work?</b></p>	   <p>Around 40 – 42 hours per week. Hospital porters may work in the evenings, at weekends and on Bank Holidays</p>
 <p><b>Useful qualifications or interests</b></p>	     <p>Volunteering in a hospital or a care home would be useful. Also supported internships such as 'The Autism Project' and 'Ambitious about Autism' offer placements as part of their training</p>
