HEAD OF SECONDARY WEST

Merry Christmas to all our families! The pupils in Secondary West have continued to build on the fantastic start they made earlier in the term. Pupils are now all very settled in their new classes and are continuing to build and develop good relationships within the department; staff are working hard to ensure that all pupils achieve and reach their full potential.

Key stage 3 pupils have continued to work on the "Myths and Legends" theme this term and have been exploring different mythical stories in their literacy lessons. In Key Stage 4 pupils have continued to explore their "Global Citizen" theme whilst working towards their entry level examinations or AQA awards.

All classes have continued to enjoy forest school each week and regular step into dance or rugby works lessons. Piccadilly class have been attending climbing lessons on Monday afternoons and have made great progress there. Northern, Central, Bakerloo and Piccadilly have enjoyed a visit to the Little Angel Theatre to watch either "Big bad me" or "The bed" and Bakerloo class enjoyed a visit to the British museum to take part in an interactive workshop based on ancient Greece. CLASS NEWS Maths:

The main focus across maths in Autumn 2 has been around

'number'. Pupils have been mastering their number bonds. For some to 10, with others 50-100. The pupils progressed into adding 2 and 5, as well as adding 10 more to numbers. For some pupils, they were confidently tackling the addition of a 2-digit number and a 1-digit number, specifically where the sum crosses the 10 mark.

Bakerloo will finish the term learning around 'measure' - Identify short/long on request and end by measuring using cm.

English:

The book of focus for autumn 2 was' *Puff The Magic Dragon*'. Most pupils have been constructing three or four part sentences about what's happening. Pupils were able to sequence events which supported them to answer comprehension questions (who?, what?, where?, and why?) Pupils used word banks to help them to write their descriptive sentences. Next half term, pupils will be reading *Coming to England* - an inspiring true story celebrating the Windrush generation.

Humanities:

In **geography**, pupils were able to identify the features of a forest. Pupils used symbols and language boards to write sentences to effectively describe a forest.

In **religious education**, pupils explored the Christian story of *Noah's Ark*. They have explored the storyline, characters, and setting, expressing their thoughts and ideas through both writing and drawing.

As part of **independence and life skills**, Bakerloo class had their trip offsite to *The* British Museum in which we practiced our travel training on the London Underground. In addition, we continued to use the food tech room once a week, reading adapted, pupil-friendly recipes to practice skills such as rolling a dough to make a shape. Pupils followed recipes to make shortbread and flatbread.

HOME LEARNING

 Our Little Wandle reading scheme books will be home with your child as well as a book of their choice. Read with/to them and practice comprehension questions throughout (who/what/where/when/why? questions)

We hope you are all doing well. Here we are to update you about what we've been up to in the second part of the Autumn Term. It has been a fun-filled and busy half term especially with all the rehearsals for our school show. What a brilliant performance it was! It's been fantastic to see everyone learning and having fun together. We're continuing to work hard to get AQA certificates in all our subjects, and here's a glimpse of some of the things we've been up to.

In English, we have talked a lot about feelings and emotions recently in our speaking and listening module. The pupils have been fantastic in expressing themselves during these activities. Next half term, we will be getting ready to read about different 'places.'

In Maths, we have finished learning about shapes and patterns and will soon dive into number facts. The pupils are doing great with all the maths concepts we have been working on!

In Science, we have explored different places where animals live. Next, we'll learn about animals, including humans, and how they change over time. We hope the pupils will be really curious and excited about this. In PSHE, we have talked about how to keep our minds healthy.

Next, we'll explore how to keep our bodies healthy and the changes our bodies go through. This term we have been 'Global Citizens' and have completed two modules each in Geography, History and RE and as part of our thematic learning in KS4. We will be moving to becoming 'Creative Citizens' and focusing on Art and Design Technology in Spring term. We have improved at reading maps and learned about the incredible Vikings and interesting myths and legends like Anansi the Spider. We also learned about winter celebrations from different religions. As part of our SEARCH values, we have been focussing on Empathy and have talked a lot about understanding and helping each

other. Next we'll be focussing on Acceptance which means being kind to everyone.

HOME LEARNING

Keep enjoying reading together at home. Reading is beneficial because it can improve focus, memory, empathy, and communication skills. It can also reduce stress and improve your mental health. There are also lots of resources available online that can help support our learning. Try some number fact games <u>here</u> and there are some phonics games <u>here</u> in preparation for our Spring reading module. Enjoy the recent legend of how Anansi got his long legs together <u>here</u>. Try these out with your child to make learning fun!

CLASS NEWS

Jubilee have been busy, busy, busy this half term.

In English we have

been working on our speaking and listening skills in a discussion unit where we have been exploring all things emotional. We've read a range of stories about managing our emotions and have discussed a variety of scenarios, looking at how we can help ourselves and others around us. We even found time for some pupils to complete a mock Entry Level Reading paper. The pupils were hugely focused and did really well.

In Maths our topic has been geometry and we have revised the properties of a range of 2D and 3D shapes. We regularly practise Entry level papers in Maths and the pupils are making great progress.

In Science we have been exploring classification of animals and have investigated some different habitats, identifying how animals have adapted to the places where they live. The pupils have completed a range of AQA units in Science and are very proud of all their work.

In Humanities we have continued our topic on migration. In Geography we have linked with Food Tech and have cooked and sampled the food and lifestyles of different cultures. In History we have been exploring the stories that have travelled with people as they've come to the UK and in RE we have learned about different light festivals. This has linked well with our Christmas Show performance where we shared a St Lucian light festival celebration with everyone as well as showing off our moves with a Soca dance!

On top of all this, pupils have engaged with social skills groups, drumming, dance, piano lessons, regular trips to Tesco and the Life Skills flat and Forest School. We can only do all of this because of Jubilee's consistent hard work and effort - we are so proud of them!

HOME LEARNING

Continue to read their guided reading and free choice books with

them. Focus on any difficult words or sounds and revisit them regularly.

- Keep cooking and shopping together. These are important life skills and a great way to work on following instructions, everyday maths skills and communication.
- Jubilee have been working on managing clothing in the Life Skills flat. Encourage them to switch on the washing machine, peg clothes to dry and match and fold clean clothes.
- Top marks is a great website for maths games. Jubilee love Hit the Button in particular.

Happy holidays from the Northern class team! As we come to the end of a long and busy term, it is

lovely to look back at the fantastic achievements of all of the pupils in Northern.

We have continued to explore the theme of 'Myths & Legends' this half term, with focus on Australian Aboriginal а DreamTime stories. The Rainbow Serpent sensory story provided pupils with engaging learning opportunities to expand both core and topic specific vocabulary. In addition, as a class we used this story as a background for our Winter Play theme and made props based on the story and culture of Australian Aboriginals. Maths focussed on basic addition through concrete representations. Pupils

continued the development of key foundational skills/concepts, including 1:1 correspondence and forming visual representations on request. Finally in, Science, Northern class explored a range of habitats and the animals associated with them. Pupils identified animal markings and described how animals move in the wild.

In addition to the foundation subjects, Northern class have covered Christianity in RE, discovering the story of Noah's Ark. Thev developed self-care and independence skills in PSHE and experimented with mark-making and typing during ICT. A highlight of the term still remains our Monday morning Yoga sessions where we have seen fantastic progress and increased involvement from the whole class.

HOME LEARNING

- As we move onto subtraction in Maths, I encourage you to find opportunities to involve number wherever possible around the home, for example: Take one cup, give one plate, how many can you see... Support with counting day to day objects ensuring that numbers are said out loud and coincide with the physical objects being counted.



CLASS NEWS

This term in maths, our main focus has been on addition. Pupils have focused on lots of skills

including number bonds to ten and twenty, adding three one digit numbers, adding a one digit number to a two digit number and adding two two digit numbers using column addition. We are now also looking at length and height, and using rulers to measure.

In English, Piccadilly class have been reading *The Legend of Robin Hood* this half term. Pupils have been working hard to answer questions about what they have read particularly who, what, where and when questions. Like last half term, pupils have been working towards writing a newspaper report about a key event from the story.

In Geography, Piccadilly class have been learning about forests. Pupils have explored and compared the Amazon Rainforest in South America, Sherwood Forest in the UK and the Black Forest in Germany. They have looked at the features of the forests and the plants and animals living there as well as considering why forests are important.

In Science, we have focused on animals and their habitats. Pupils have explored rainforests, deserts, the Arctic and the ocean. As part of this, they considered what animals live in each habitat and how they are adapted to their habitat. They have also looked at food chains.

In RE, we have been reading the Christian story, Noah's Ark. The children have retold the story, described the characters and discussed the significance of the rainbow at the end of the story. Well done on another fantastic half term Piccadilly Class. We are all so proud of you! Have a great winter break.

Secondary West department pupils focus on specific gross motor skills every half term during PE lessons. This half term pupils focused on developing their running technique, jumping with two feet, balancing, hopping, throwing and catching. Pupils have also explored handball and tag rugby.
