



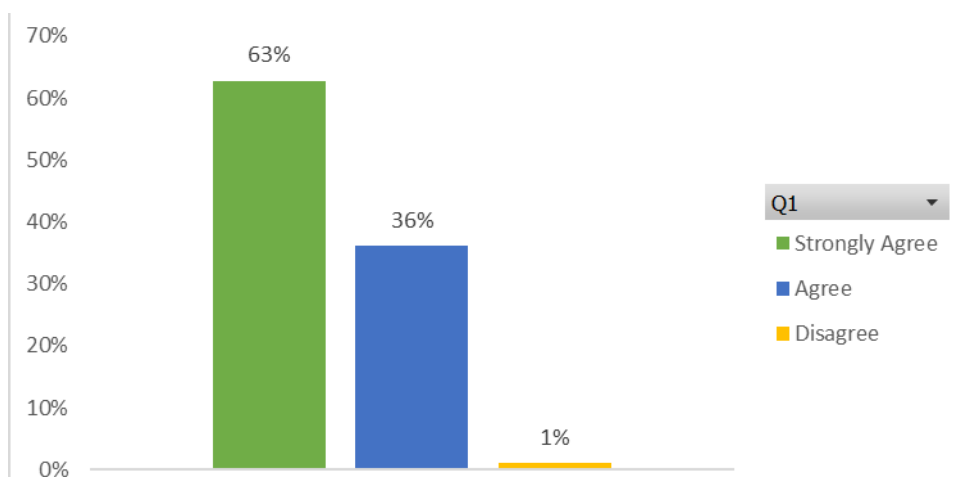

Report on Year 12 Parent Questionnaire November 2021

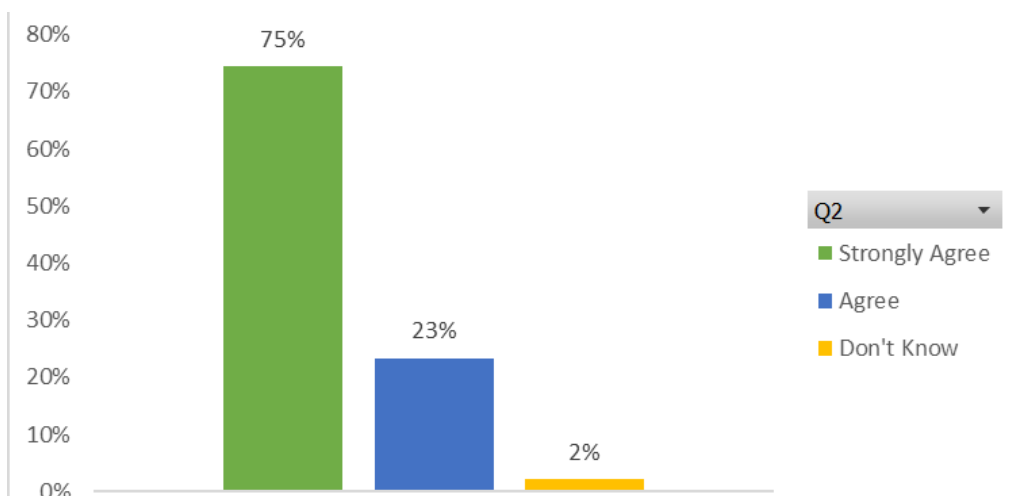
- Parent/ Guardian return: **44%** of families responded to this questionnaire i.e. 94 returns from 214 families.
- The parent questionnaire is based on an online questionnaire used by Ofsted to gather the views of parents/carers on their child's school, though the survey also invites feedback on transition into Sixth Form, spiritual, moral and faith development.

The results of the survey are summarised below.

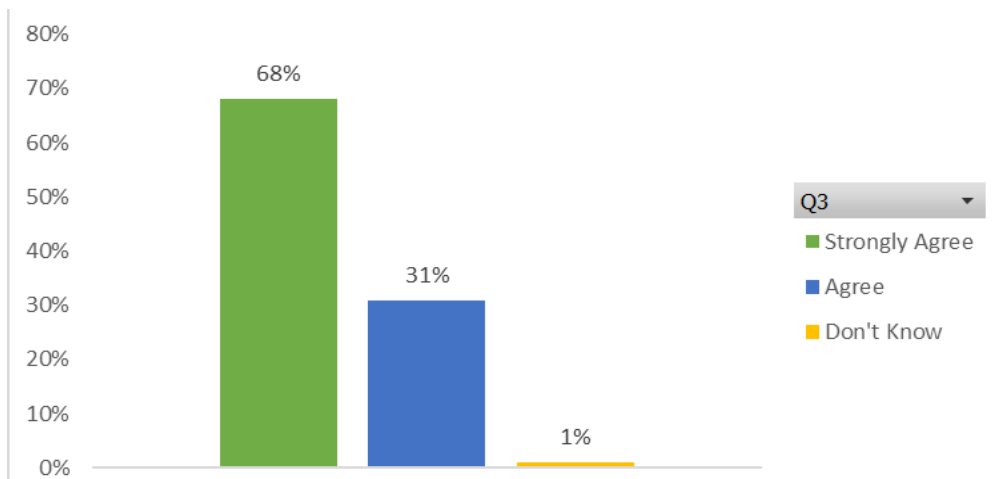
Q1. My child is happy at this school.



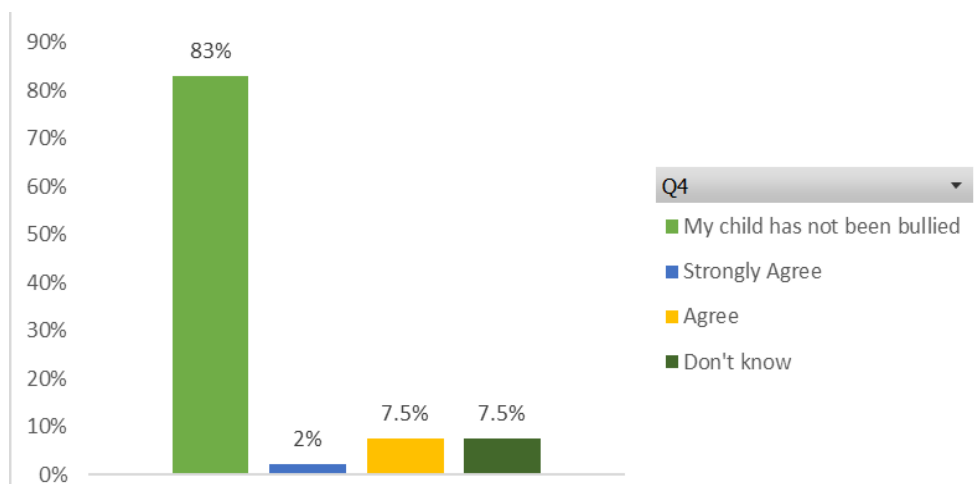
Q2. My child feels safe at this school.



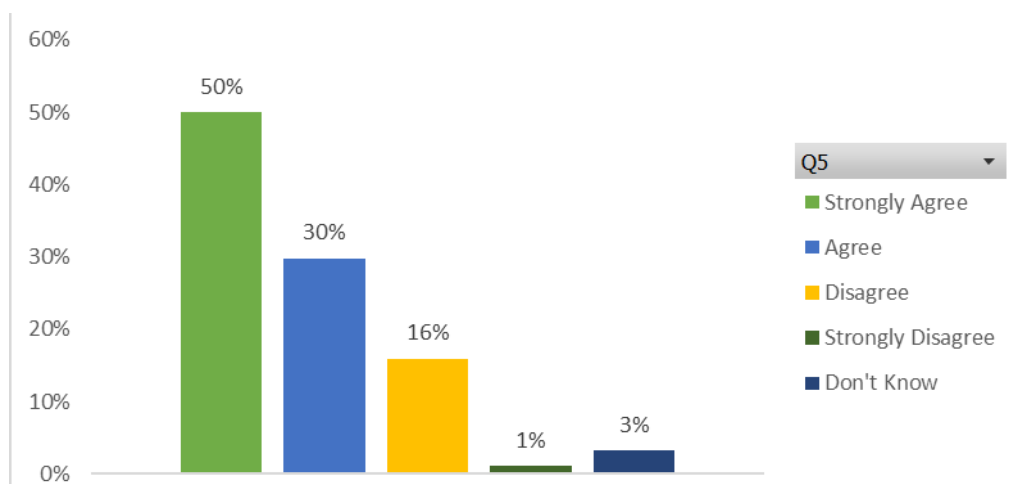
Q3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.



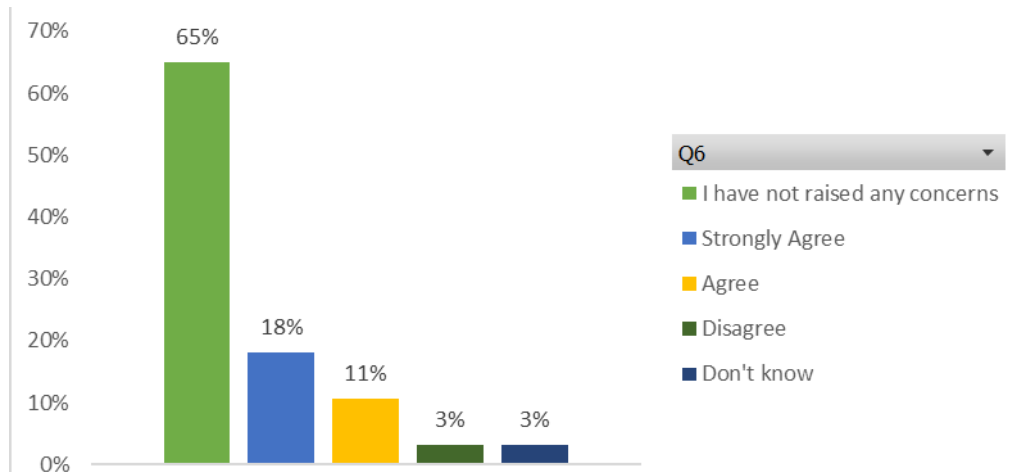
Q4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



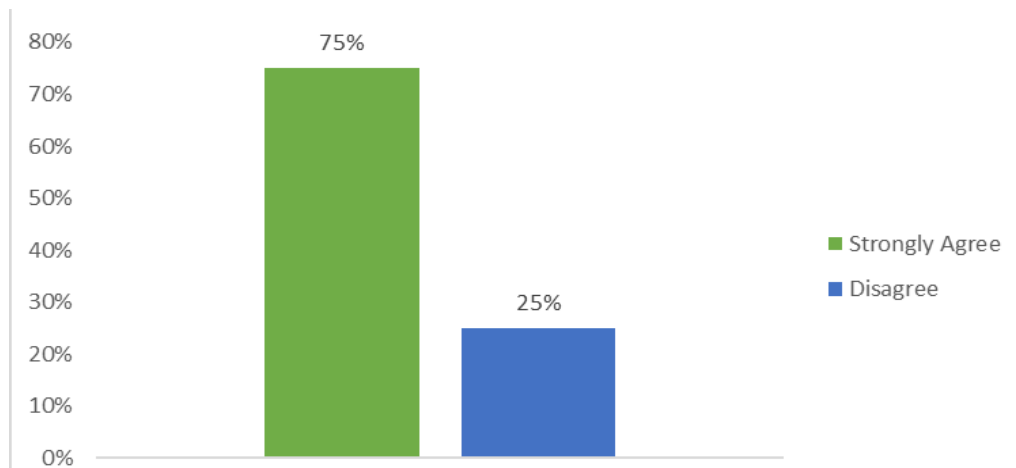
Q5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.



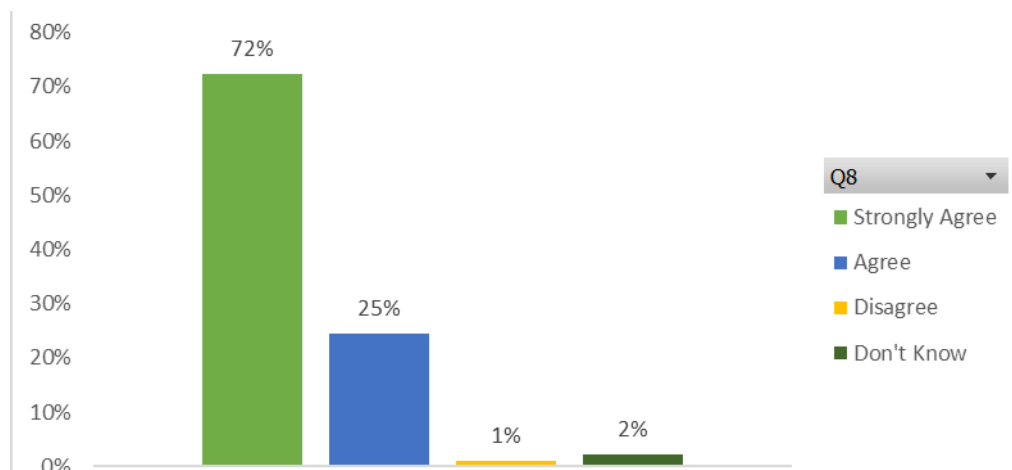
Q6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.



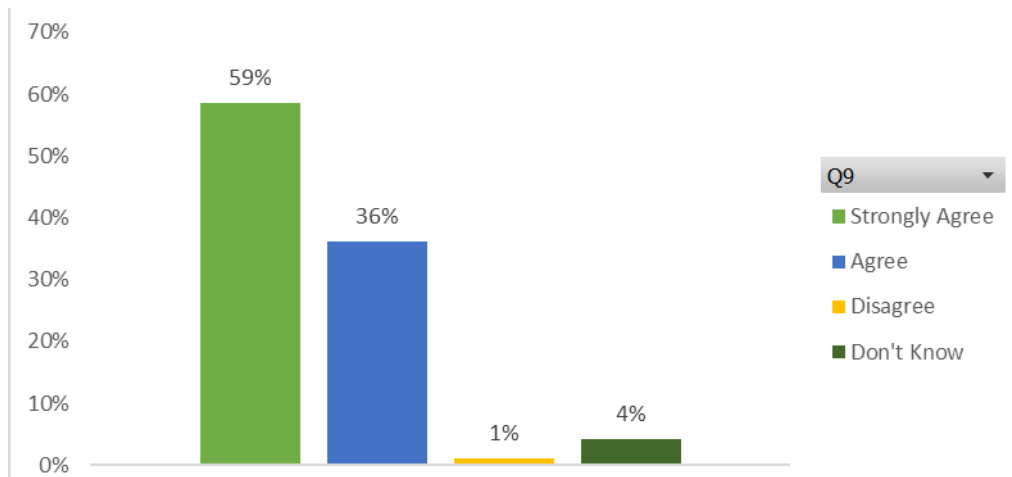

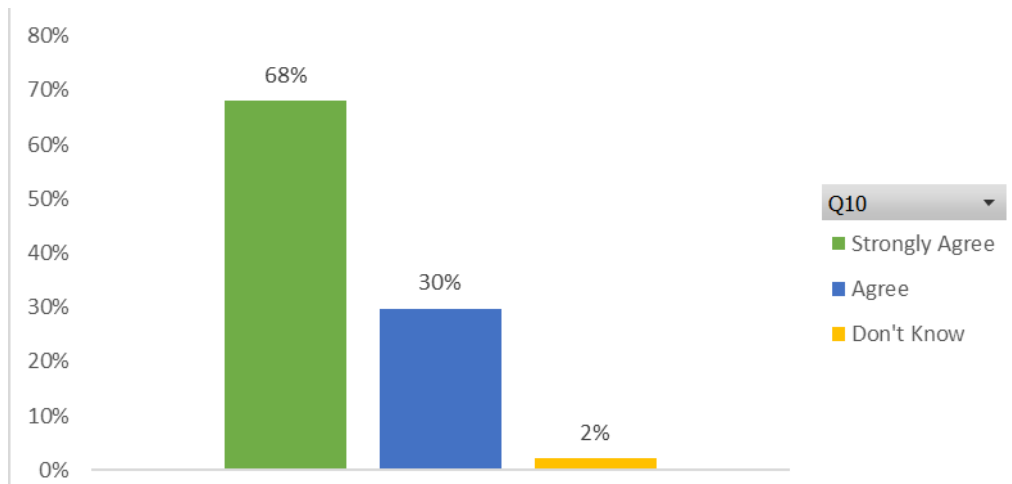
Q8. The school has high expectations for my child.



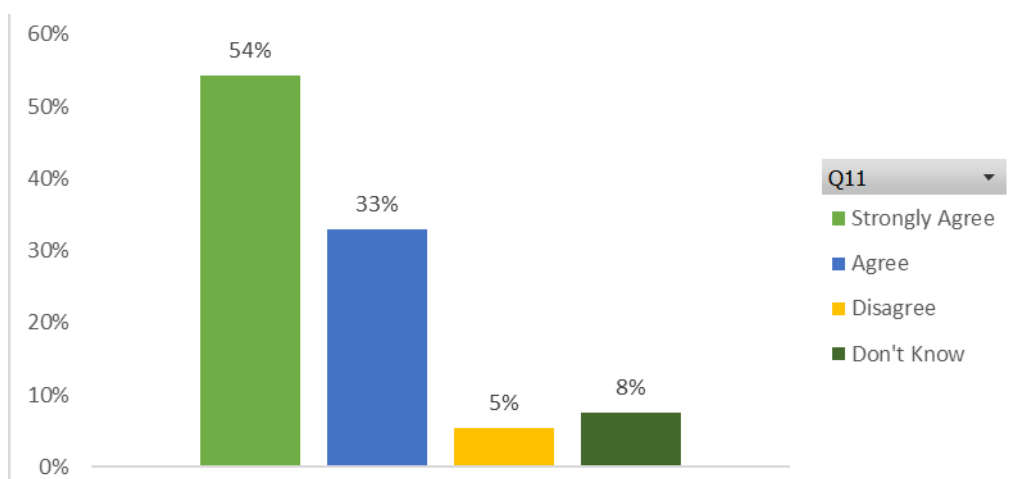
Q9. My child does well at this school.



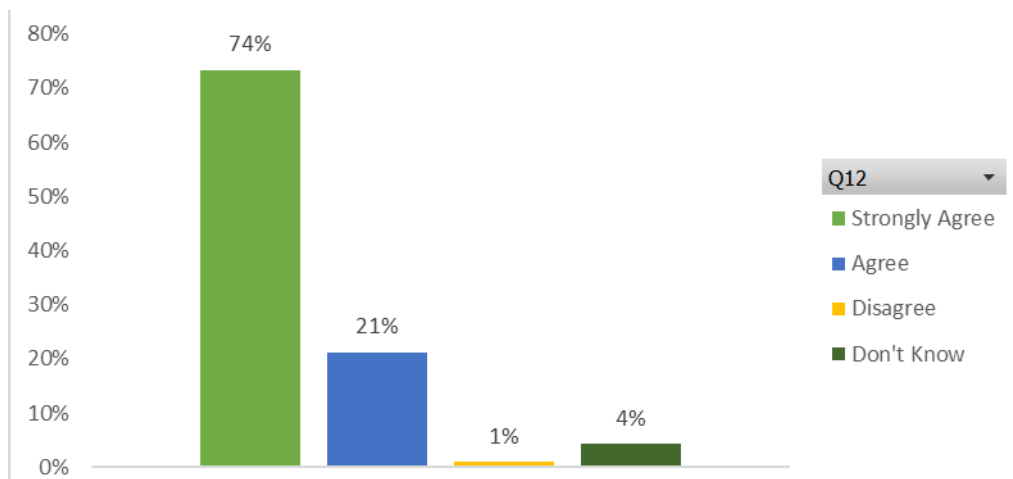
Q10. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.



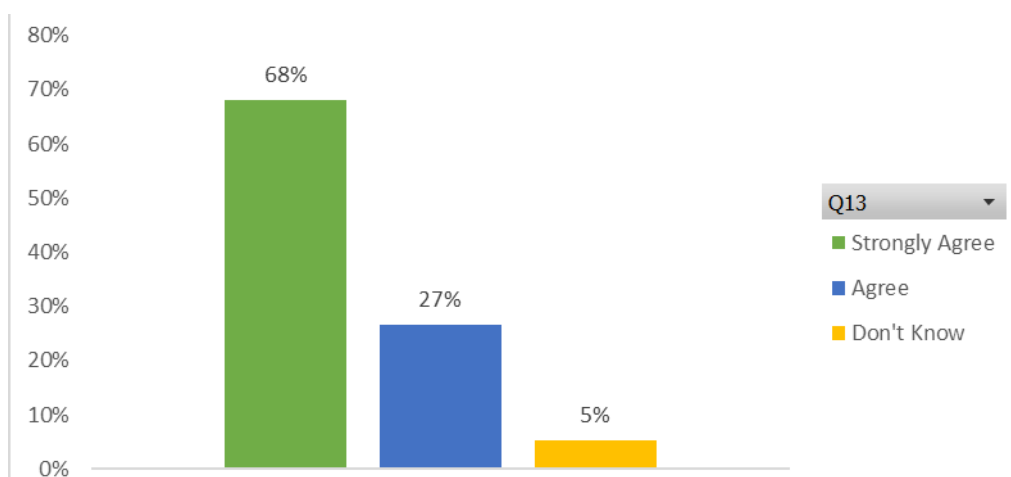
Q11. The school supports my child's wider personal development.



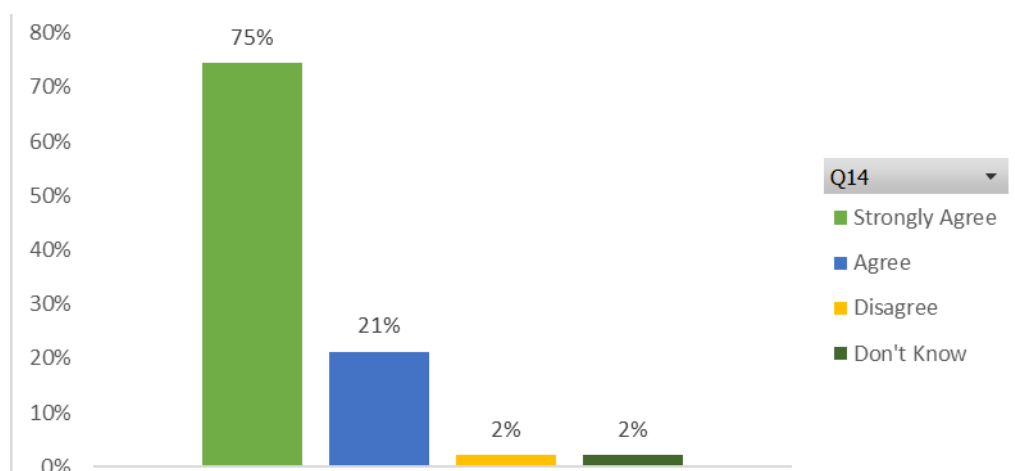
Q12. I am happy in the way the school develops and encourages the development of the Catholic faith.



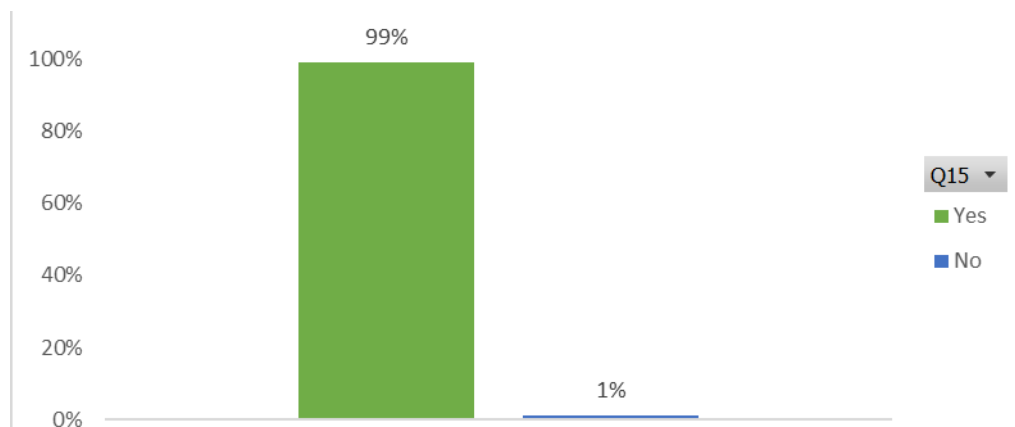
Q13. This school provides well for the moral and spiritual development of my child.

Parents were asked whether they would recommend this school to another parent. Of the 94 parents that responded to the questionnaire all responded as yes with the exception of one.

The questionnaire provides parents with the opportunity to expand on any responses to questions. The school has followed up on all such queries directly with parents.

Parent comments include:

- I am satisfied that my daughter is settling in well and I satisfied with the opportunities she has to develop herself.
- The school has always been number 1 for me and I have had two children leave the school that was an excellent platform for them to enter the real world.
- Very happy with the Sixth Form so far. Thank you for all your hard work.
- I am extremely happy that my child is attending Trinity. He is happy, and all my interactions with the school have been very positive. Sharon Hughes has been so responsive and kind when dealing with my queries. The staff at the school are great.
- Trinity Catholic High School supported my child quite well in her transition to sixth form at perhaps the most difficult time ever for everyone up and down the country. The school has consistently provided a happy, safe and nurturing learning environment and experience for my child. I therefore have no hesitation whatsoever in recommending Trinity Catholic High School to my family and friends.

Comments about transition:

- My son enjoys sixth form more than any other time spent at school. He loves it!
- The school communicated very well with my daughter regarding her application for 6th form and emailed her several times over the Summer which helped make her feel their pastoral care was good - something that was very lacking elsewhere. All communications showed genuine care for the individual within the school and that the school was there to help her succeed rather than the other way round.
- The transition appeared seamless despite all the difficulties everyone has experienced during Covid, the school should be proud of how they adapted and what they have achieved.
