


Report on Year 7 Parent Questionnaire November 2021


- Parent/ Guardian return: 67% of families responded to this questionnaire i.e. 157 returns from 235 families.
- The parent questionnaire is based on an online questionnaire used by Ofsted to gather the views of parents/carers on their child's school, though the survey also invites feedback on transition from primary school, spiritual, moral and faith development.

The results of the survey are summarised below.


Q1. My child is happy at this school.




Q2. My child feels safe at this school.




Q3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.




Q4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.




Q5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.




Q6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.






Q8. The school has high expectations for my child.




Q9. My child does well at this school.




Q10. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.




Q11. The school actively promotes reading for pleasure.




Q12. The school supports my child's wider personal development.




Q13. I am happy in the way the school develops and encourages the development of the Catholic faith.




Q14. This school provides well for the moral and spiritual development of my child.

Parents were asked whether they would recommend this school to another parent. Of the 157 parents that responded to the questionnaire all responded as yes with the exception of one.

Comments about transition:

- Very happy with my daughter's transition to secondary school, feel that they have been cared for very well and appreciate the support of all the staff.
- For the most part my daughter has settled into school well, she has made some good friends, enjoys most of her classes and has mostly adjusted to the volume of homework compared to what was expected a primary school. We feel that it is still early days and just hope that she continues to have a positive experience both personally and academically as time goes on.
- Given my child came from a small primary school, he has been settling in well. Of course, it does take time but it's better than we expected.
- The transition from primary to secondary school was very smooth and we are delighted to see that our son has settled well in his new class and is very happy at school. While he is still mixing with his friends from primary we note that he has also made several new friends and his interests and experiences are rapidly expanding. Home study is certainly a new experience for him however we are encouraged that he is being stretched and challenged to meet his full potential.

- My son was part of SEaTSS and the support / feedback from this was first class, in particular, the fact that the staff involved already had a very good understanding of his personality and strengths / weaknesses to work on.

- It was unfortunate that due to the Covid pandemic my child was not able to access any transition days before commencing secondary school. However, I believe the school made efforts to accommodate a smooth transition when possible and my son has settled in well.

School Action
