


Report on Year 11 Parent Questionnaire March 2022


- Parent/ Guardian return: 50% of families responded to this questionnaire i.e. 118 returns from 237 families.
- The parent questionnaire is based on an online questionnaire used by Ofsted to gather the views of parents/carers on their child's school, though the survey also invites feedback on spiritual, moral and faith development.

Q1. My child is happy at this school.




Q2. My child feels safe at this school.




Q3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.




Q4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



Q5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.




Q6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.




Q7. My child has SEND (special education needs and/or disabilities), and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.


Below breakdown includes responses from 11 parents whose child has SEND and answered the question (3 parents did not).




Q8. The school has high expectations for my child.




Q9. My child does well at this school.




Q10. The school lets me know how my child is doing.




Q11. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.




Q12. The school supports my child's wider personal development.




Q13. I am happy in the way the school develops and encourages the development of the Catholic faith.

Parents were asked whether they would recommend this school to another parent. Of the 118 parents that responded to the questionnaire all responded as yes with the exception of four.

The questionnaire provides parents with the opportunity to expand on any responses to questions. The school has followed up on all such queries directly with parents.

School Action:

- The curriculum aims to support students' holistic growth providing a rounded education that nurtures excellence in its many forms - intellectual, physical, emotional, spiritual and social. Our CPR curriculum (Citizenship, PSHE and RSE) supports students' wider personal development and the time allocation for this aspect of the curriculum has been increased for the next academic year.
- The School has created the role of Personal Development Coordinator. This member of staff will lead on enhancing our co- curricular offer so that it better supports the interests, needs and aspirations of our students building further opportunities for personal development.
- Our curriculum is detailed on the school website with an overview of the curriculum at each key stage and specific information about each subject at KS3, KS4 and KS5. Details of this information will be referenced in our regular communications with parents.
