

Trinity Catholic High School A Level Results 2024

Trinity students have again achieved excellent results with an A Level pass rate of 98% which is above the average for Redbridge state funded schools and particularly impressive given our Sixth Form cohort is one of the largest in the area and offers a wide range of subjects. Our results across key Headline Measures have further improved on the gains made last year despite the return to pre-pandemic grading systems and we are incredibly proud of our students for their achievements.

Some of the most significant achievements are as follows:

Summary of Key Headlines

Almost a quarter of grades were A*-A, an increase of 3% on 2023 results.

168 grades A*-A were achieved overall.

27 students achieved A*/A across all subjects which is a truly outstanding accomplishment. (20 students in 2023)

11 students achieved grades A*-A across 4 A Level subjects.

44% of all students were awarded A*-B grades, an increase on 2023 results.

Key measures

Average Point Score (per A Level entry): is **33.29** (2023: 32.71)

Average Point Score (expressed as a grade): is **C+**

Percentage of students achieving at least AAB in at least 2 facilitating subjects: is **14%** (2023: 11%).

Percentage of students achieving at least 3 A Levels A*-E: has **increased by 3%** since 2023 to **86%**

Subject specific information

The pass rate for 17 of our A Level subjects was 100%. **Particularly impressive were our Science results at A*/A grades which exceeded national averages as follows: Chemistry 50% A*/A (National: 32%), Biology 43% A*/A (National: 27%), Physics 33% A*/A (National: 32%) and Economics A*/A 37% (National: 30%).**

Students also excelled in the Arts with **A*/A grades in English Language and Literature double the national average at 31% (National: 14%), Spanish A*/A grades of 75% (National: 37%)** and in **Drama with A*/A grades of 33% (National: 22%),**

The pass rate for other Level 3 qualifications were pleasing with 43% of students taking the Extended Project Qualification achieving A*/A and 100% of students passing the CTEC in Digital Media and 91% passing the BTEC in Food Science and Nutrition.

Progression to University

Nearly 200 of our students applied for places at UK universities. The process was as always, competitive, yet 77% successfully gained places at their first choice of university with others being placed with their insurance choices. This year, we have also seen an increase in our students gaining apprenticeship places and we are very pleased to have been able to support all of these young people with their ambitions.
