Cath was deeply loved by all who knew her. She was a deeply caring teacher, mentor, and friend. Beyond the classroom, she supported school expeditions to Bolivia, travelled widely with her husband Alan, and even summited Kilimanjaro in 2012. After being diagnosed with

Motor Neurone Disease in 2024, Cath continued to serve others with remarkable courage and faith, taking the Eucharist to the sick and



praying for others even as her own strength declined. She remained cheerful and grateful to the end, attending both her daughters' weddings in 2025.

Her life was a testament to her faith and kindness. Cath's legacy is one of humility, compassion, and grace to act justly, walk humbly, and live tenderly.




ASSEMBLIES CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING AT TRINITY

The SHARP system allows students to raise issues such as bullying, online safety, hate crime, weapons, health and wellbeing, or any other worries they may have either about themselves or someone else. Reports can be made anonymously, ensuring every student has a voice and a safe way to be heard.
