Dear Students, Parents, Carers & Governors

This week the highlight of the week was the Trinity community gathered for one of the most meaningful moments in the school calendar as we celebrated our Year 13 Leavers' Day and formally introduced a new Trinity tradition, the Sixth Form Leavers' Tree Planting Ceremony.



This new tradition will now become an important part of life at Trinity. Each Year 13 cohort will plant a tree as a lasting symbol of their journey, contribution and legacy within our school community.

The ceremony reflects our belief that education is about far more than examination results. It is about formation, service, leadership and the impact we leave on others.



This year's group has demonstrated remarkable resilience, commitment and leadership throughout their time at Trinity.

As the first senior year group to help establish the school's renewed vision, they have lived out the values of Truth, Compassion, Hope and Service with authenticity and purpose. In doing so, they have helped shape the culture, identity and future direction of Trinity Catholic High School.

They have also played an important role in helping form and embed our new school Mission:

“Empowered by faith and compassion, we strive for excellence, celebrate individuality and inspire voices to shape a better world.”

This Mission has not simply been words displayed on walls. This year group has brought it to life through their leadership, service, advocacy and daily example within the Trinity community.

As part of the inaugural ceremony, the Year 13 students planted an olive tree on the school grounds. Throughout history and Scripture, trees have carried deep symbolic meaning.

The Bible speaks of oaks of righteousness, cedars of Lebanon, fig trees and the tree of life. The olive tree in particular represents peace, endurance, wisdom and hope.



After the flood, it was an olive branch carried by the dove that signalled new life and a new beginning for Noah. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Christ prayed among olive trees before His Passion, reminding us that strength is often formed through perseverance, faith and sacrifice.

Like the olive tree, we pray this year group remains deeply rooted in faith and values, continuing to bear fruit through lives of compassion, courage and service long after leaving Trinity.

We were also reminded during the ceremony of the symbolic passing of the Trinity Lantern, which had taken place during the Year 13 students' final assembly a few weeks earlier.

The lantern, representing faith, wisdom, leadership and hope, was handed over to the new student leadership team as a sign of continuity, responsibility and trust. Our outgoing Year 13 students carried its light with dignity and pride throughout a year of significant change and renewal for Trinity.

They now pass that responsibility on so the next generation of leaders may continue to flourish and shape the future of our school community.

One of the most powerful moments of the afternoon came as every member of the year group placed a handful of earth around the newly planted tree. A simple but profound act which symbolised that every individual has played a part in the story and legacy of the Class of 2026.

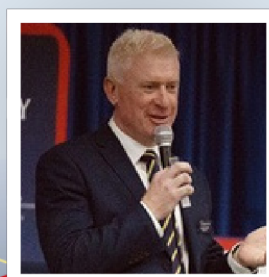

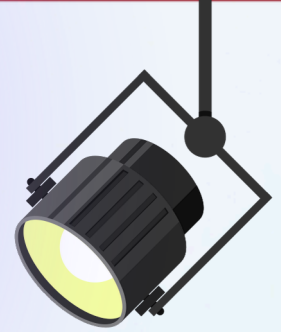

There was laughter, applause and a few emotional moments as students looked back on the experiences that have shaped them over the past seven years.

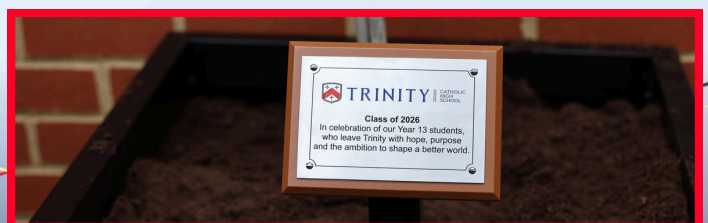
The assembly also included a range of awards and prizes recognising the outstanding achievements, commitment and contribution of students across the year group. This included a few fun awards for students.

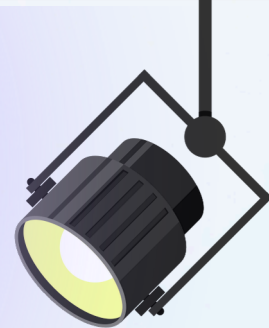

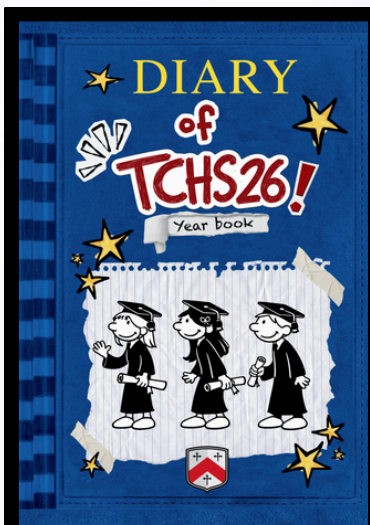
Class of 2026 Celebration

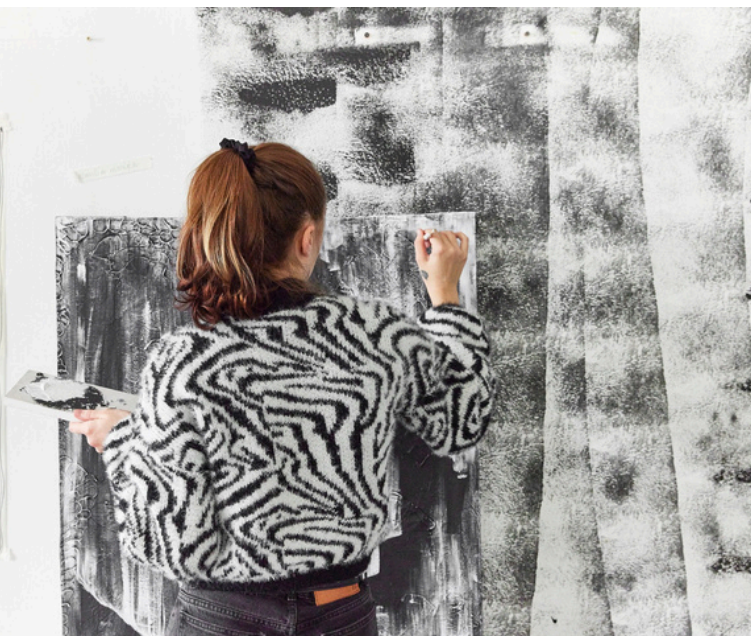

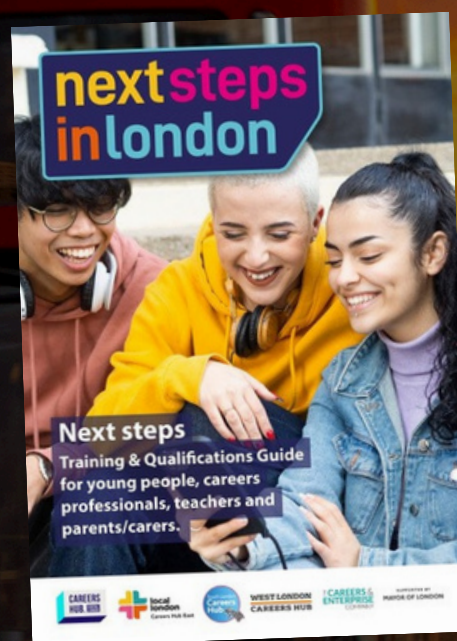

The SHARP system allows students to raise issues such as bullying, online safety, hate crime, weapons, health and wellbeing, or any other worries they may have either about themselves or someone else. Reports can be made anonymously, ensuring every student has a voice and a safe way to be heard.


