**Dear Students, Parents, Carers & Governors**

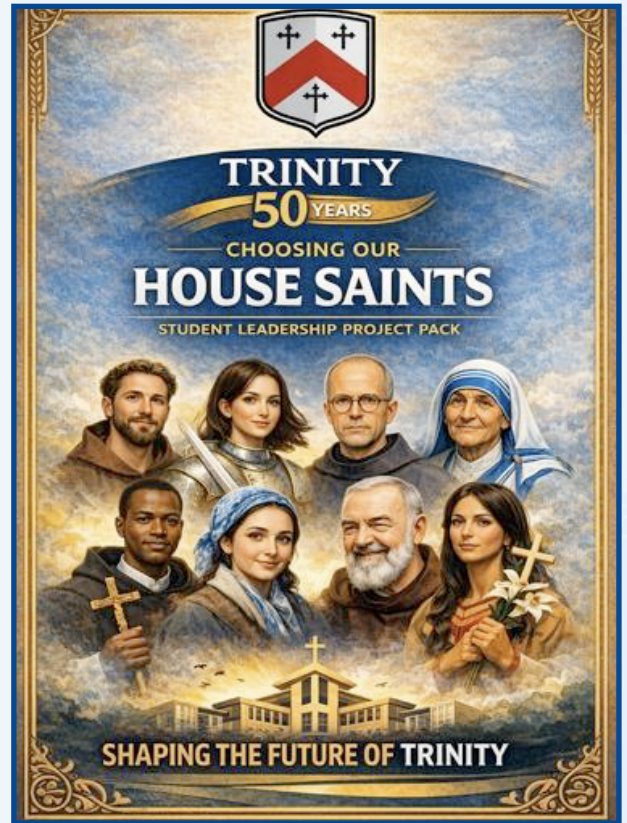
As we reach the end of another busy and productive half term, I would like to sincerely thank you for your continued support throughout the year.

We are also preparing to introduce new management systems, including Arbor and Class Charts, to strengthen communication and streamline processes between school and home.



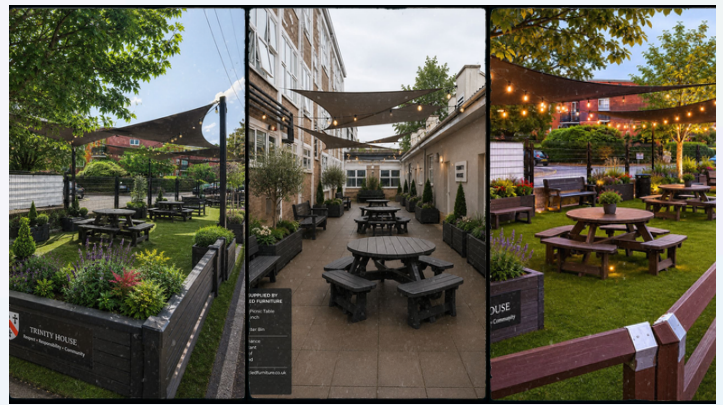
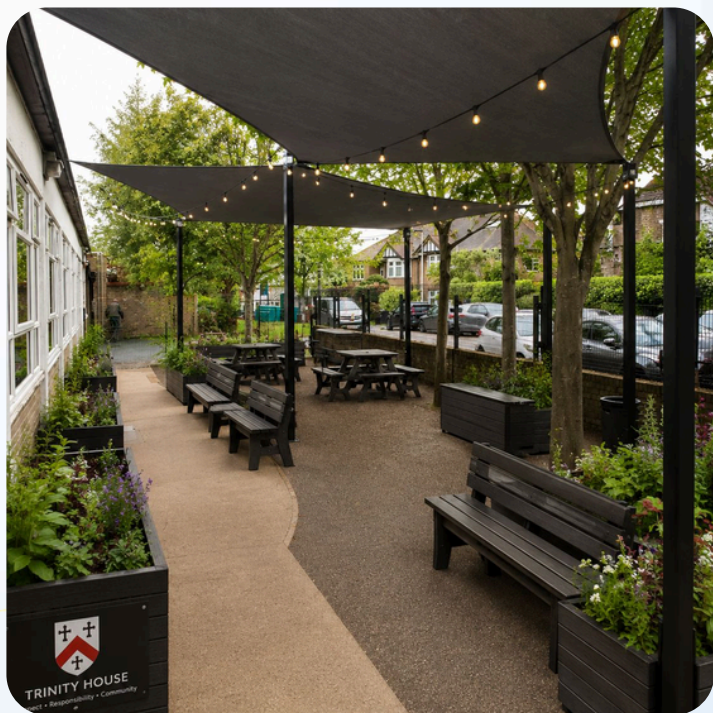

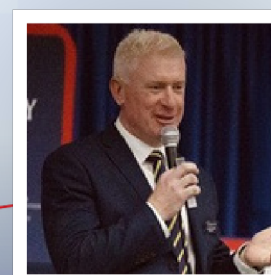

# Trinity Alumna Yemi Mary John Breaks the 50-Second Barrier in Sensational 400m Victory



Trinity Catholic High School is celebrating the remarkable success of former student Yemi Mary John, who has become the newest member of the prestigious sub-50-second club in the women's 400m. Yemi produced a stunning performance at the Seiko Golden Grand Prix in Tokyo, storming to victory in a personal best time of 49.85 seconds. Her achievement now places her as the number one ranked women's 400m runner in the UK and seventh in the world this season, an extraordinary milestone and an inspiration to the entire Trinity community.

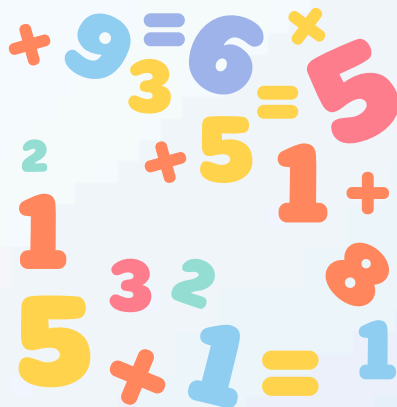

Mrs Clarke attended as Trinity's representative, reflecting the school's outstanding commitment to the Duke of Edinburgh's Award programme across all levels.

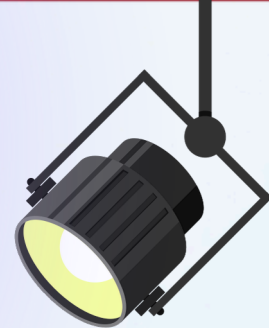
