We continue to review our curriculum offer and timetable design to make sure both remain effective and efficient, and I will share a full update with you in the coming weeks.

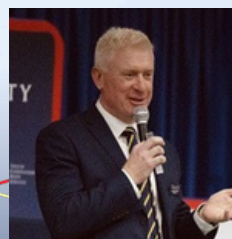
Trinity Fest

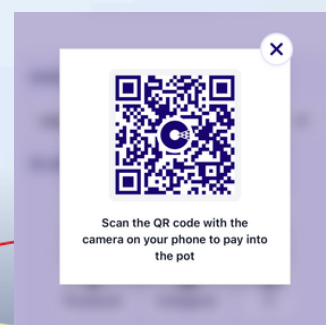
Why Trinity Fest Matters

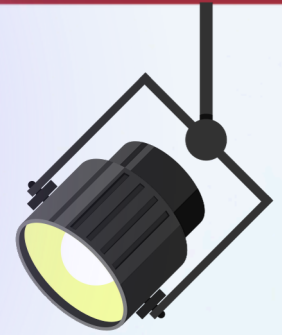

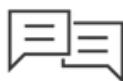

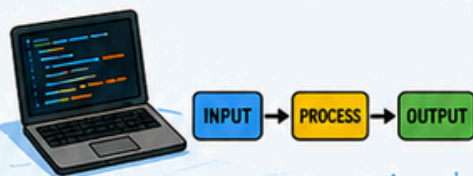

YEAR 7: BUILDING FOUNDATIONS

It has been a real pleasure to meet our newest cohort!

Year 7 is about transition and building up strong foundations, from e-safety and responsibility through to inputs, outputs, variables and controlling data flow with **Python programming**.

More recently we covered Boolean logic, types of computer hardware, how logic circuits, hardware and software all relate to each other. This embeds a real understanding of what computers are, what they can do and how they do it.



YEAR 8: EXPLORING AI

This year continued building on those sound principles from year 7. E-safety from last year is complemented by **Cyber-Security** this year.

Last year's Python programming skills are put into practice as we use them to study key algorithms and solve problems through application of **Computational Thinking**.

More recently year 8 have covered AI. This has covered a range of types of machine learning and does include use of LLMs. Our students have trained a Machine Learning model of their own so that it can, for example, recognise different types of fruits from an image.

In our final term in year 8 we are starting an exciting, brand-new project! In collaboration with the Science department (more about this overleaf!)



YEAR 9: GAME DESIGNERS

What a delight to be able to welcome Year 9 back to Computing!

Prior to the recent change in school timetable the Computing Curriculum only existed for the two lower years. Gaining year 9 means we can now really embed the foundations of the two previous years in a very exciting way.

In year 9 we now work on a project that really brings together all the strands of computing (IT, Digital Literacy and Computer Science) as students embark on the design and production of a computer game of their very own.

This is a real enterprise that year 9 embark on, presenting a concept and producing a design through to the production of a new, original and playable computer game. Also creating a business model and production of promotional material!

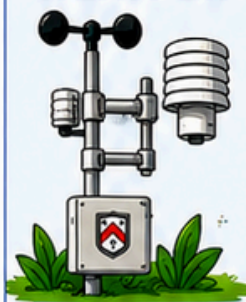

YEAR 8 COMPUTING AND SCIENCE WEATHER PROJECT



Computer Club have built a weather station which records a snapshot of data to a database every minute. It has been doing this 24 hours a day, 7 days a week since the end of this February.

The Science and Computing departments are very excited to be working together with year 8 this half term and will be making use of this new kit!



In Science, students will learn about weather. In a Computing lesson they will collect data about the local weather from our database which they will take back to their next science lesson and will analyse that data and draw conclusions. Showcasing the relevance of both of our subjects and really helping students to understand how useful computing is as a tool to accomplish specific goals.

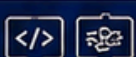

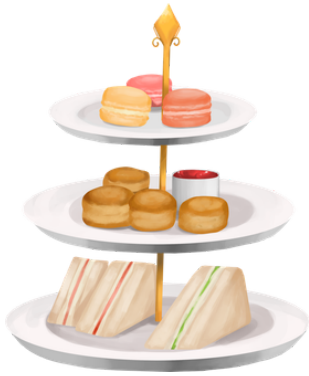

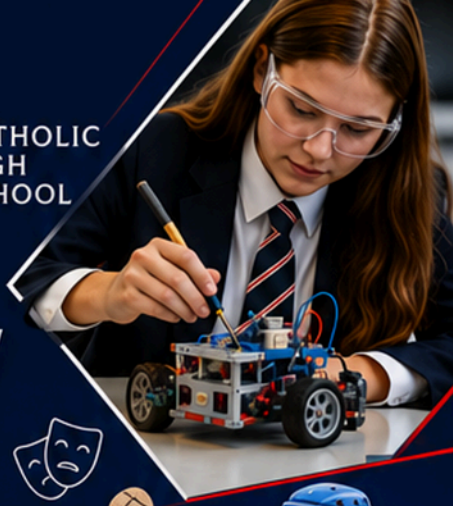

At Trinity Catholic High School, the safety and wellbeing of our students is always our top priority. We are proud to launch the SHARP system (School Help Advice Reporting Page) A confidential online platform that empowers students to report concerns and seek support quickly and securely.

The SHARP system allows students to raise issues such as bullying, online safety, hate crime, weapons, health and wellbeing, or any other worries they may have either about themselves or someone else. Reports can be made anonymously, ensuring every student has a voice and a safe way to be heard.
