We are incredibly proud of all our athletes for their commitment, determination and sporting excellence. Well done to everyone who competed and represented the school so brilliantly.

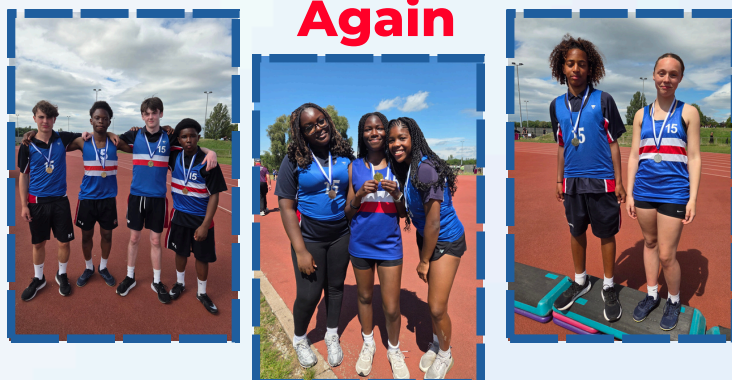
Jemimah Supports England at Hockey Pro League Matches

Year 9 and 10 Athletes Crowned Champions Again

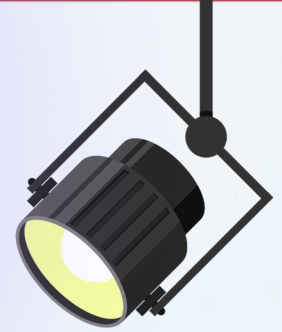

Supporting Your Child with Their University Personal Statement

Year 12 students are currently working on their university personal statements, with a first draft due before the end of the academic year. Students should be using Unifrog to research courses, record their achievements and experiences and support the drafting process.

Parents and carers can help by:

- Encouraging students to reflect on why they want to study their chosen subject.
- Discussing work experience, volunteering, reading and wider activities that demonstrate their interest in the subject.
- Supporting students to explain what they have learned from these experiences.
- Proofreading drafts for spelling and grammar while ensuring the content remains the student's own work.
- Encouraging students to meet deadlines and make use of the guidance available through Unifrog and school support sessions.

A strong personal statement takes time and reflection and we encourage all students to engage fully with the process over the coming weeks.

Working in teams, students will navigate their way across the capital, completing a range of challenges that test teamwork, communication, problem-solving and resilience. 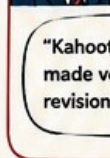

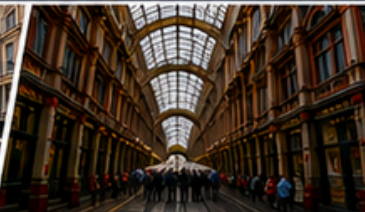

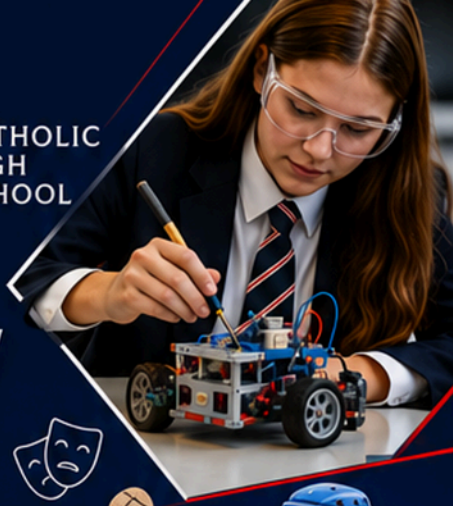
