

## **Character & Citizenship Policy**

Our inclusive Church of England Academy seeks to transform lives. We do this by encouraging all members of our school community to:

We create a stimulating, challenging and rewarding learning environment in which all are supported to flourish and strive for excellence. We help our students feel strong today so they can have bright hope for tomorrow.

The academy creates a learning environment, curriculum, experiences and relationships in which all individuals can find expression, be nourished and developed. The academy commits itself to creating an environment for everyone that is characterised by our core values of truth, justice, forgiveness, generosity and respect.

Character education at The St Lawrence Academy comprises PSHE, citizenship and RSHE. There is a separate RSHE policy available on the academy website. Character education is seen as being a whole school mission, and is delivered through various strands including: dedicated Character lessons, other curriculum areas, raising aspirations days (RAD), tutor time, reflection time, leadership roles, information evenings, personal guidance from the school coach, assemblies & visiting speakers, participation in national events, work and through service to the community. Character Education has adopted a hybrid model of delivery, strengthening our provision by introducing interactive aspects via 'The Talk' platform. This has increased our number of PSHE/RSE lessons to over 300 across both key stages. The school website contains information and links to information about Character education under the Student Experience section. There are separate policies for CEIAG (Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance) and provider access. CEIAG policy and Provider Access Policy.

Effective teaching ensures that core knowledge is broken down into units of manageable size and communicated clearly to pupils, in a carefully sequenced way, within a planned programme. Teaching includes sufficient well-chosen opportunities and contexts for pupils to practice applying and embedding new knowledge so that it can be used skilfully and confidently in real life situations. It is an age appropriate, developmental curriculum, meeting the needs of pupils and we aim to develop it in consultation with parents and the local community. The St Lawrence Academy is compliant with the Equality Act of 2010.

Data from the regular North Lincolnshire Adolescent Lifestyle Survey (ASL) is used in planning our Character curriculum, ensuring we are meeting the needs of our students.

The relevant SLT and House Leaders work closely with colleagues in related curriculum areas to ensure the character curriculum complements content covered in national curriculum subjects such as science, food technology, computing and PE. Students' prior knowledge is checked and built into the character planning process to ensure a smooth transition between primary and secondary education.
